

2025 Roebling Road Summer Races Drivers Letter

July 5 – 6, 2025

Welcome to the Roebling Road Summer Races. This event has been on the Southeast Division calendar for many years and marks the final 2025 event of the Southeast Conference Majors Tour. It's also a long standing event for the South Atlantic Road Racing Championship.

It goes without saying that high temperatures play a big role in this event. We're all friends here, so keep watch over your paddock neighbors for signs of heat related issues and don't hesitate to ask for help. Stay safe, hydrated, and in the shade as much as possible.

The only way into the paddock is to cross the track between sessions; if you have an early session, it's in your best interest to arrive before the gates close at 8am for the first session. There's nothing worse than arriving late and watching your race group enter the circuit while you're outside.

I should be arriving to the track by 6pm on Friday; I'm usually in the Tech/Impound area throughout the event. If you are currently on Probation, you must see me before you go onto the track for your first official session on Saturday morning.

Roebling Road Raceway has a stricter sound policy than most. In addition to a maximum of 103db, a closed black flag with the car number and a "Sound" board (usually a large letter S) will be displayed on the FIRST reading over 103. The SECOND reading over 103 will result in an open black flag, which means you must go to the pit lane. You must make repairs before returning to the course.

Roebling Road has a mandated Quiet Time on Sunday from 11am until 12 noon. When we start racing again on Sunday afternoon, we've scheduled time to allow everyone in the race following Quiet Time to get to grid without having to rush too much. Also, no race engines running from 8pm until 8am all days.

We have combined Groups 1 & 2 for all sessions. That drops the number of groups down to six total, so we shouldn't have to push the schedule. We're going to space out the groups a little and we plan to take a 15 minute worker break following the Group 5 races on Saturday and Sunday. Listen to the PA and stay aware of which group is on track.

Most of all, we want everyone to have a successful weekend, avoid contact, and be able to take your car home without significant damage.

Thank you for being here; a racetrack is a lonely place without you.
