A commitment to a welcoming environment and the SCCA Values is expected of all its members and attendees, including drivers, workers, crew, guests, staff, contractors and exhibitors, and other participants at SCCA activities, sessions and social events and when representing the SCCA in print or electronic media.

### SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS

This event is governed by the 2023 General Competition Rules (GCR) and Category Specifications, as amended for 2023 per "Fastrack" and these Supplemental Regulations. Time Trials (TT) sessions are governed by the 2023 National TT Tour Rules.

All races will be conducted under the 2023 MID-AM rules and will count towards the Championship. See MidAm Championship Regulations - Midwest Division SCCA (midiv.org)

### I. REGISTRATION and FEES

**A. TEST DAY:** Ozarks International Raceway will be hosting a test day on July 14th. This is a track sponsored test day AND IS NOT covered under the SCCA event sanction and insurance.

Preregistration is available on Motorsportsreg, information at www.ozarksinternationalraceway.com

On-site registration is available July 13, 5:00 PM to 9:00 PM and 7:00 AM to 3:00 PM on July 14, 2023.

- **B. ENTRY FEES:** Entry fee for the two-day weekend is \$550.00. An additional compliance fee will be charged per entry for the weekend of \$20 for Spec Miata and \$30 for SRF-3 and FE2.
- **C. PAYMENTS:** Drivers who complete their registration online, via the <a href="www.motorsportreg.com">www.motorsportreg.com</a> website, will have the option of paying by check/money order, or credit card, at the time of registration. Entry fee payments for online registrants not received by the Registrar by July 12, 2023 may result in a delay in processing your registration at the track. Make checks payable to **KVRG, SCCA**. A fee in the amount of \$35, will be charged for any check returned by the bank.
- **D. REFUNDS**: A full refund will be made if the entry is withdrawn prior to receiving a Tech sticker. If you pre-enter and are a no show, your check will be destroyed, and any credit card payments will be credited back to your card. If you sign in at registration but do not pass Tech, you must notify the Chief of Registration, *BEFORE YOU LEAVE THE TRACK*, in order to receive a refund. No refunds will be issued if you participate (turn a wheel) in any session.
- **E. REGISTRATION:** Drivers can register for the race online at <a href="www.motorsportreg.com">www.motorsportreg.com</a>. Drivers without internet access may request a paper entry form and mail it, with their entry fees, to the Chief Registrar:

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At event Registration will be at approximately 7 AM to 3:00 PM and 5:00 PM to 9:00 PM on Friday, July 14th and will be located in the small house at the entrance to the track. Tech will be open Friday from approximately 6 – 9 PM in the main garage on Friday evening.

- **F. EXPRESS TECH:** Drivers with both a current annual tech and a current year helmet sticker may bring just their vehicle log book and completed tech card to get their event stickers.
- **G. PASSES:** The entry fee entitles each entry to five (5) passes to include all drivers, entrant, and crew members as applicable. Only SCCA members will be issued crew credentials (weekend members are eligible). Non-members will receive visitor/guest passes and may not enter hazardous (hot) areas. Members and non-members must wear their credentials/passes visible at all times. Credentials are valid only for the person to whom they are issued (GCR 4.5). Credential fraud of any kind may result in a penalty
- **H. PADDOCK/PARKING INFORMATION:** Parking regulations are hereby incorporated in these regulations by reference. Failure to follow the direction of the Paddock Marshal or her/his designate regarding paddock parking or activities may result in expulsion from the facilities. **Marked parking spaces adjacent to the garages on both sides are reserved for those that rent / reserve a garage space for the weekend.**

**PROVISIONS:** Camping is allowed in the paddock on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. Electricity may be available in limited areas of the paddock. A charge for electricity may be assessed. Do not park in spaces where electricity is provided if you do not intend to connect, as the electricity charge will be assessed whether you connect, or not.

**J. PREFERRED NUMBERS:** For entries received by the registrar through noon on July 7, 2023, Majors Series numbers that were reserved via the Majors Series Registration prior to the opening of online registration for this event will receive priority assignment. Secondary preference will be given to 2022 MIDIV reserved number holders. Due to the combination of classes within the run groups this may not be possible in all cases. At noon on July 7, 2023, all unused reserved numbers will be released on a first-come, first-serve basis.

### **II. DRIVER INFORMATION**

- **A. DRIVER ELIGIBILITY:** Drivers must be a current member of the SCCA and have a current SCCA Full Competition license to participate in this event. SCCA Pro Racing licenses are not accepted. If you do not have the proper credentials, it is your responsibility to contact the Registrar prior to the event. Drivers and crew members are urged to obtain Annual Waivers in order to expedite the check-in process.
- B. CAR ELIGIBILITY: Competition is open to all cars conforming to the GCR, as amended.
- **C. TIMING & SCORING**: All cars are required to use fully operational transponders, and the driver is responsible for providing correct information to Timing & Scoring. Make sure your transponder is on and functioning for ALL SESSIONS. Information gathered from data collection systems and/or personal timing







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systems is unofficial and will not be used by race officials. Cars without working transponders may not receive times.

- **D. RADIO FREQUENCIES:** Reserved radio frequencies will be posted not later than Thursday at registration. These frequencies may be monitored but shall not be used for communication by any participant.
- **E. COURSE:** Will be using the full, 3.970 road course in clockwise direction.
- **F. RACE LENGTH**: For Majors groups Saturday races will be 25-minute timed races. Sunday races will be 12 laps/45 miles or 35 minutes, whichever occurs first.
- **G. BLACK FLAG:** Black flags will be displayed at start/finish and between turns 14 & 17. Drivers must report to the steward in the pit lane. Digital black flag stations may also be used.
- **H. TRACK LIMITS:** Cars shall not cross the blend line at the exit of the pit lane whether approaching on the track or pit lane side. Violation of track limits may result in penalties.
- **I. PACE/SAFETY CAR:** In addition to GCR 6.6.2., the field shall follow the Pace/Safety car as long as its' emergency lights are flashing, even if it varies from the normal racecourse. In the event a full course yellow results in the dispatch of the safety car, the safety car will enter the racing surface at pit out.
- **J. FLAT TOW:** There will be no attempt at bump starting a vehicle while under flat tow. Drivers must have, at a minimum, a race helmet, gloves, and lap belt in place anytime the race car is under flat tow on the racecourse.
- **K. HARDSHIP LAPS:** Hardship laps will be available for a limited number of cars between sessions, time and schedule permitting. A hardship lap is defined as a single lap from pit out to pit in. Any driver requesting a hardship lap must do so from the Race Director or Pit Stewards.
- **L. AWARDS:** Trophies for all races will be awarded in accordance with the GCR. Trophies will be presented at the event. Majors points will be awarded for all races in accordance with the GCR.
- **M. VICTORY LAPS:** Winners of all races will receive a checkered flag. Victory laps may be allowed depending on time. Drivers need not wear their helmet.
- **N. CAMERAS:** All cars competing at Regionals, Conference Majors, Super Tour events, and the SCCA Runoffs must have a forward-facing camera that is recording at all times while on track and provides a clear horizontal field of view of the cars and track ahead. The cameras may be mounted either inside the car, or on the body. If video is needed as part of an investigation of an incident, a competitor's video of the full unedited session may be requested by race officials regardless of whether or not said competitor was involved in the incident. Failure to provide such video may result in penalties. The video format must be a digital file so it can be viewed in an MS Windows compatible viewer.

### **III. CAR SAFETY AND TECH INSPECTION:**

- A. DECALS: The official SCCA Road Racing Summit racing decal is required.
- **B. TECH INSPECTION:** All drivers without a current year helmet sticker must present all driver gear as required by the GCR, vehicle logbook, and completed tech card to Tech. If your car requires an annual







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tech you must coordinate with the Chief of Tech when/where that will be done. Tech will be located inside the main garage building.

- **C. SCALES:** Will be available at Tech when Tech is open. During impound, priority will be given to the impounded cars. The Chief of Tech may designate additional times when the scales are open.
- **D. SPEC MIATA COMPLIANCE:** At post-race inspection, Spec Miata participants may be instructed by the designated Class Compliance Chief (CCC) to remove parts, including but not limited to the cylinder head, for disassembly and/or inspection. Competitors are responsible for performing required disassembly and/or reassembly of their car, as well as any resulting expenses incurred. The CCC will report any findings of non-compliance to the Race Director, who will then determine the need for a Chief Steward's Action (CSA) or Request for Action (RFA).

### IV. QUALIFYING/RACE

- **A. GRID**: Starting positions for the Saturday race will be determined by the fastest time recorded for each car from the preceding qualifying session. Starting positions for the Sunday race will be determined by the fastest time recorded for each car during any of the preceding qualifying session(s) or the fastest lap during the Saturday race. Cars arriving at the grid after their group has been dispatched on track may, at the discretion of the Operating Steward, be held at pit out and released at the end of the pack after the field has completed the pace lap.
- **B. START/FINISH**: The race will begin and end at the stripe in front of the start stand located on the left-hand side of the track.
- C. COOL DOWN LAP/ BLACK FLAG ALL: Following the checkered flag or black flag all, all cars will be directed to exit the course at the crossover road on drivers left between turn 3 and turn 4 and reenter the course just before turn 15 and proceed to pit lane.
- **D. LAST LAP INDICATOR**: When possible, a waving white flag will be displayed at start/finish to indicate the last lap has begun.

#### V. IMPOUND

- **A. MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETING**: <u>Impound All</u> may be given at the end of the first Qualifying session for each group to conduct a drivers meeting. Impound will be in the tech area inside the center of the main garage building.
- **B. IMPOUND**: The top three (3) competitors in each class must go directly to tech when leaving the track after a race. The Race Director/Chief Steward may also direct additional cars to be impounded, go directly to tech if directed to do so when leaving the track (after any session).
- **C. CONTACT:** GCR Section 6.11.1.E requires that the driver and car, involved in significant body contact, to stop at the designated incident investigation site for review of the incident by stewards. Drivers shall satisfy this requirement by reporting to the Race Director or Chief Steward during Impound of their race group.







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### **VI. GENERAL**

**A. SPLIT STARTS**: The Race Director/Chief Steward will consider requests for split starts received no later than 15 minutes after the qualifying session.

**B. RACE LENGTH**: For Majors groups Saturday races will be 25-minute timed races. Sunday races will be 12 laps/45 miles or 35 minutes, whichever occurs first. In case of a long delay and where the time limit has expired, the Race Director may convert to laps to allow a green, white, checker to complete the race.

**C. RESULTS:** Live timing will be available during the event. Unless otherwise announced, live timing will be available via the Race Hero or Speed Hive App available for iPhone and Android phones. Qualifying, provisional and final results will be posted at Hospitality in the garage area where tech is located. Final results will be posted to the SCCA Majors (<a href="https://www.scca.com/majors">https://www.scca.com/majors</a>) website no later than 7 days following the completion of the event. Copies will be posted to the KCR and KS Region websites (<a href="https://www.kcrscca.org/">https://www.kcrscca.org/</a> or <a href="https://www.ksscca.org/">https://www.ksscca.org/</a>).

D. START TIMES: Start times are cars on course

**E. EVENT SCHEDULE/RUN GROUPS**: The event schedule or run groups may only be changed at the discretion of the Race Director, with concurrence by the Race Chair, depending on pre-race entry counts or as needed to accommodate situations that may be encountered during the event. If changes are made prior to the start of the event, as much notice as possible will be given to all affected competitors. The published schedule is for planning purposes only. Actual session start times may deviate from the published schedule based on actual event progression.

- **F. CANCELLATION:** If part of an event is cancelled for reasons of safety or forces beyond our control as provided by GCR Appendix B 1.1.A., points will be awarded based on race grids.
- **G. CLOTHING:** Closed toe shoes and safe apparel must be worn in the pits at all times. Crew members on pit lane must display their event credentials at all times while on pit lane.
- **H. FUEL:** Fuel Will be available at the track **but must be ordered in advance**! 100 octane unleaded, 110 octane unleaded and 116 octane leaded fuel selections can be purchased. Information at: www.ozarksinternationalraceway.com
- **I. TIRE VENDOR:** Tire service will be provided by the track.

### **VII. TRACK RULES**

A. GENERAL RULES: ATV's, bicycles, motor scooters/cycles are permitted in the paddock provided they are used in a safe manner and operated ONLY by licensed drivers. Skateboards, skates, rollerblades, micro/mini racers and go-peds are NOT permitted. No person will be admitted into the raceway without the proper credentials. Absolutely NO bedding new brakes or testing of cars on infield roadways will be permitted. Violations will result in immediate ejection from the premises. This penalty will be enacted for all offenses, with zero tolerance. You must leave the facility no later than three hours after the last Checker falls on Sunday.









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**B. FACILITY CARE** – You are expected to leave the facility in the same condition as when you arrived. All trash must be properly disposed of before leaving your paddock area. **Fees may be assessed to those that damage the property in any way.** 

Oil and fluids must be disposed of properly as provided by the facility

Do not leave used tires at the track.

## Absolutely NO stakes in the pavement allowed – no exceptions

All vehicle / trailer leveling jacks must use pads to protect the asphalt surface – no exceptions.


