COVID-19 Safety Guidelines

Notice to Participants: In light of the current COVID-19 situation, every attempt will be made to minimize the risks of exposure to the virus. New processes and procedures will be put into place for events as new guidelines are developed by the SCCA National Office and federal, state and county government authorities.

Ultimately, it is your responsibility to assess the risk to you, both on-track and off, and to make the decision on whether or not to participate. If you are feeling unwell or are experiencing symptoms such as fever, cough, or shortness of breath please stay home. If you have been in contact with someone who has been experiencing these symptoms in the last two weeks, please stay home.

While on site please take the health and safety of your fellow participants, volunteers and staff into consideration and practice social distancing and wash your hands and/or use hand sanitizer frequently. In accordance with current guidance, wearing a mask is optional

If you are diagnosed with COVID-19 within two (2) weeks of attending an SCCA event, please notify the Event Registrar immediately.

Specific procedures for Maui SCCA events:

- If you are sick or symptomatic, stay home. If you become sick before the event, you will not be charged if you do not attend.
- Bring their own personal protective equipment (PPE), including masks (if being used), gloves, hand sanitizer and disinfectant. There will be a limited supply of PPE on hand for essential worker needs only.
- Events are closed to spectators. This includes family members. Only preregistered drivers, (1) pit crew per driver from the same household/bubble, and authorized essential workers will be allowed entry to the event. Pit crew are not permitted to bring their own vehicle. No walk-up registration.
- Observe all social distancing (6 feet), sanitizing and handwashing guidelines.
- IR Temperature will be taken at the entry gate prior to entry. Anyone exceeding 100.4°F will be sent home.
- The drivers meeting will be conducted via our public address system. Maintain social distance if you attend in person at the bus.
- The timing and scoring tent will be limited to essential workers only with no more than 5 working at any one time.
- Course walkers & workers must maintain proper social distance. Follow current Public Health Emergency Rules regarding total allowable number of attendees and attendees per group.
- Unnecessary handling of waivers, wristbands and course working equipment should be avoided. Wristbands will already be separated, and course working equipment will be sanitized between each heat.

- Grid spots shall be spaced to maintain social distance. Drivers in active grid should remain in their vehicles as much as possible unless performing vehicle checks between runs.
- Paddock spots shall have an extra stall between cars. Stay in your paddock as much as possible when not working or driving.
- Rookie Walks & In-Car Instructors are not allowed until further notice.
- Co-Drivers are only allowed with members of your direct household and those consenting and registered as official codrivers. Co-Drivers not from the same household shall practice all social distancing guidelines and maintain enhanced sanitation of shared equipment.
- Fun Runs are not guaranteed and is dependent on the day's schedule, as well as the Event Chairperson's discretion. One passenger may be permitted from same household at the discretion of the Event Chair.
- Drivers will tech their own cars under the supervision of tech staff.
- The loaner helmet program is suspended until further notice. BYOH.
- Sanitize all equipment and work surfaces throughout the day. After your work assignment, use the materials provided to wipe down all radios, headsets, flags, keyboards, pens, work surfaces, etc.

Maui SCCA is working to keep our members as safe as possible and to allow us to host events in compliance with City, County and State standards. We need your help to be successful. Please keep in mind:

- ♣ Some of our members are in high-risk categories. Others may have at-risk family members at home. Do your best to keep them safe.
- ♣ Respect your fellow members. Your opinions about current guidelines are not shared by everyone. Show respect for your friends by your behavior.
- ♣ The virus is not the only threat to our events. Government officials and news organizations have the power to end our season. So, behave as if your day of racing, and everyone else's, depends on it – because it does.

Noncompliance with these safety guidelines may result in your removal from the event.

These guidelines are our best attempt to secure your safety given what is known at this time. They are by no means comprehensive, and we cannot predict every circumstance. We are counting on you to exercise your best judgment throughout the event.

There should be no congregating or socializing before or after the event. All attendees must promptly leave the facility once the event has concluded.

Failure to follow any of these guidelines or any County of Maui guidelines, including the Public Health Emergency Rules may result in the revocation of this permit.

Concessions are not allowed.
