The Annapolis Trust will help students complete a post-high school education, connect with opportunities to learn to their fullest potential, and become engaged, working members of the community. By investing in our youth's education, we can cultivate leaders for generations to come and end cycles of poverty and hopelessness.

OUR STORY & SUCCESSES

The Annapolis Trust was founded in 2000 by then-CEO of the County Boys & Girls Clubs, Reginald Broddie, to assist local in-need youth in creating a career vision for themselves and providing a means to accomplish it. The Annapolis Trust provides more than scholarships – our mentoring program is key to our student's success in completing college or technical school and in building a better life for themselves and future generations.

- Annapolis Trust Scholars have a graduation rate of 83% -- more than six times the graduation rate of first-generation-to-college students according to Pell Research
- Over 73 scholarships \$300,000 awarded to date, averaging award is \$800/semester (\$6,400 total/4 year degree)
- There are 14 Annapolis Trust students currently enrolled in college and two just graduated May, 2015.
- Mentoring program includes one-to-one mentor for every student
- A Career Network of local professionals provides students with opportunities for career exploration, planning and hands-on experiences
- Since 2002, the Annapolis Trust has provided scholarships for over 23 high school students to attend Gordonstoun International summer camp in Scotland
