

# Midwestern Council 2020 Standardized Supplemental Regulations

## 1. General Event Regulations

- 1.1. This event is sanctioned by the Midwestern Council of Sports Car Clubs, and insurance conforms to MCSCC requirements. This event will be held under the MCSCC General Competition Regulations, Track Regulations and all Supplemental Regulations.
- 1.2. Drivers are responsible for notifying crew and guests of the hours Registration is open. Entry may not be available beyond posted hours.
- 1.3. Minor guests must be under adult supervision at all times.
- 1.4. A slow and safe speed shall be maintained in the paddock at all times. Reckless driving (such as warming/cooling of tires or brakes) is prohibited. Riding on the exterior of vehicles is prohibited.
- 1.5. Paddock/Parking on access roads is prohibited. Paddock/Parking on paved surfaces must only be done in the designated areas as indicated by the chief steward or designated representative.
- 1.6. No intoxicants may be consumed by drivers, crew or guests before the end of the last race or other on-track activity. There may be General Admission spectators not registered with event sponsors which are not subject to this rule.
- 1.7. No illegal drugs or controlled substance shall be tolerated on the track premises at any time unless prescribed by a doctor.
- 1.8. Any and all protests, questions or complaints against any competitor's car or driving or against any race specialty should be made to the Event Chief Steward or his/her designated assistant as stipulated in the GCR. In no case should complaints be directed to any race worker in any specialty.
- 1.9. All race support vehicles (ATVs, golf carts, etc.) must bear a legible placard with the entrant's car number and class designation.

## 2. Special events

- 2.1. The test day is open to competition licensed drivers per these regulations. While cars do not have to meet any particular class rules as designated in the MCSCC GCR, they must meet the safety requirements for an appropriate class as designated by the Chief of Tech or the Chief Steward.
- 2.2. Each entry is allowed three (3) crew members. Test day entrant's passes are only valid for Thursday. Race entrant's passes are valid after noon Saturday and all day Sunday. Entrants for both the test day and race will get passes valid for the entire weekend.
- 2.3. Paddock for Spec Miata Racers for Sunday is to be on the inside of turn 14 between the main road and the track, and the bottom of the hill by the gear box to the track before turn 14. Overflow parking is available once all spots are taken on the north side of turn 5.
- 2.4. Paddock for Test Day participants is limited to the north side of turn 5. If space becomes limited, more paddock locations will be opened up.
- 2.5. Paddock spaces are in a first come first serve basis. No reservation of spots will be allowed.
- 2.6. All Spec Miata Racers are required to run a sponsor decal board on both sides of the car and in between the front and rear tire. In addition, cars are required to run a Midwestern Council sticker on the front of the car. All stickers will be provided at tech.

## 3. Race (Wheel-to-Wheel) Supplemental Regulations

### 3.1. Race Entry & Registration

- 3.1.1. Races are open to drivers holding a valid current MCSCC, SCCA (Pro, Full Competition or Novice with one race signoff minimum), WHRRI, BMWCCA(full), EMRA, CASC, PCA(full), NASA(full), ACC Levels 1 and 2, SVRA, or VMC racing license.
    - 3.1.1.1. Other licenses to be evaluated on an individual basis by the Event Chief Steward in consort with the Competition Licensing Director and Competition Director.
  - 3.1.2. 14 thru 17 year olds may compete if they hold a Midwestern Council Minor Participation License or a competition license from a recognized sanctioning body and conform to all procedures required of that license.
    - 3.1.2.1. Persons *who* enter this event with an MCSCC Minor Probation License must personally present his license to the Event Chief Steward accompanied by his attending parent/guardian.
    - 3.1.2.2. If another sanctioning body license is used, the minor driver with the attending parent/guardian needs to present to the Event Chief Steward a copy of the "MINOR RELEASE OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT" (Minor Waiver) provided to the sanctioning body for the Competition License indicating car number and class in which the minor will be participating. Should this copy not be available, some form of verification of parent or guardianship needs to be available.
    - 3.1.2.3. It is the responsibility of the Minor Participant to personally retrieve his license from the Event Chief Steward accompanied by his attending parent/guardian before leaving the track property.
    - 3.1.2.4. Before the attending parent/guardian leaves the track property, he must report to the event Chief Steward that he is doing so before leaving and again upon his return. The minor participant will NOT be allowed on the race track if the attending parent/guardian is not present.
  - 3.1.3. All drivers must be prepared to show at registration a current approved competition license.
- 3.2. Race officials reserve the right to alter the schedule or race groups for good and sufficient reason, and to re-assign car numbers where required.
  - 3.3. Test day (Thursday) entry fee is \$295. Race (Sunday) entry fee is \$295. Combined weekend (Test day and race) entry fee is \$550. All entries must be received by July 28 at 8 PM Central time. No walk-in registrations will be permitted. Full refunds will be given if cancelled before the entry deadline. No refunds will be given after the entry deadline.

## 4. Race Tech & Impound

- 4.1. To be allowed on track, all cars are to display a sticker issued by the Chief of Tech or his/her designated assistant indicating that, in

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his/her opinion, the car conforms to all safety regulations and marking requirements as detailed in the MCSCC GCR.

- 4.2. Drivers whose competition vehicles have logbooks issued by other sanctioning bodies must present all logbooks at any technical inspection.
- 4.3. Helmets meeting Snell SA2015 or SA2010 are required.
- 4.4. The scales at impound are the official scales. Scales will be available throughout the weekend.
- 4.5. Sound control - All cars are required to comply with the decibel limit established by the track (see track regulations). If a car is recorded in excess of the limit during an on track session, the first two times driver will be notified of the infraction as the car enters the paddock and instructed to make repairs. If the car is subsequently recorded in excess of the limit it will be Black Flagged and disqualified from further competition.
5. **Race Timing & Scoring**
  - 5.1.1. AMB TransX 260 transponders are required for all wheel-to-wheel entries. A limited number of transponders will be available for rental. Rental Fee is \$50 for the weekend and requires a \$300 Security Deposit (refundable.) Rental Fee and Deposit requires cash, or two separate checks (no credit cards.) Rentals will be handled at registration. Renters will be notified where to return the transponder and retrieve the deposit. DO NOT take transponders into the building housing Timing and Scoring. Transponders are also available for purchase from MYLAPS Sports Timing at 678-816-4000 or online at [www.mylaps.com](http://www.mylaps.com), as well as from other sources.
  - 5.2. All cars must display registration assigned numbers per the GCR. Failure to conform will result in written/verbal notification by the Stewards. Cars appearing in subsequent sessions without conforming will receive a Black Flag. The car will then be directed to the paddock for repairs. If the second offence is during a qualifying session, no time will be counted prior to the issuance of the Black Flag for a grid position. The car will be allowed to return to the track after repairs have been completed during practice and qualifying sessions. Should a car fail to conform to the GCR number requirements during a race, the car will receive a Black Flag and be directed to the paddock. Drivers are responsible for providing all materials needed to create acceptable numbers.
  - 5.3. Drivers must complete 5 verified laps of practice and/or qualifying in order to be eligible for the race, or have permission of the Event Chief Steward.
    - 5.3.1. Grid positions for races will be determined by computerized electronic timing system.
    - 5.3.2. A driver may elect to start from the back of the grid regardless what the best timed lap for the car may be.
6. **Race General**
  - 6.1. Safety belts, helmets and all driving gear must be worn during cool off and victory laps.
  - 6.2. All drivers, with their cars, involved in metal to metal contact will be directed to impound immediately upon exiting the track with or without assistance. A Steward will meet them there to inspect the vehicles and collect reports from the drivers involved. The car and driver will remain in impound until released by the Steward. Cars involved in consecutive race groups may be released from impound immediately by the steward, but must return to impound after that session before returning to the Paddock.
  - 6.3. Blocking is defined as making more than one move, left or right, to impede an overtaking car. When reported, the offender will receive a blocking flag from the Starter. The Blocking flag from the starter stand is the display of a waived Blue Flag accompanied by a Ferruled (Closed) Black Flag. If you continue to be reported to be blocking, you will be issued a black flag.
7. **Road America Track Regulations**
  - 7.1. **ALL PERSONS ENTERING THE ROAD AMERICA RACE TRACK WILL HAVE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:**
    - 7.1.1. A current –VALID spectator ticket.
      - 7.1.1.1. A ticket with stub(s) upon entering.
      - 7.1.1.2. A ticket AND A VALID "Pass-Out" upon re-entering.
    - 7.1.2. A VALID credential (accompanied by a signed insurance-waiver witnessed by Road America/Club Staff personnel (PARTICIPANTS ONLY):
      - 7.1.2.1. Road America CREDENTIAL.
      - 7.1.2.2. Event sponsoring CLUB CREDENTIAL, which is PROPERLY VALIDATED.
      - 7.1.2.3. Appropriate weekend WRISTBAND.
  - 7.2. **UNLICENSED VEHICLE GUIDELINES:**
    - 7.2.1. RACE VEHICLES being used in the race event are allowed on R/A property
    - 7.2.2. AUTHORIZED ROAD AMERICA VEHICLES with a current year sticker are allowed on R/A property
    - 7.2.3. Participants may use unlicensed light vehicles and equipment carts but must have a current event sticker or yearly permit for the use of such vehicles on Road America property. These will be referred to as "pit vehicles."
      - 7.2.3.1. "Pit vehicle" registration (includes signing a liability waiver and acknowledgment of proper insurance) and fees must be taken care of at registration (locations may vary).
    - 7.2.4. Furthermore, according to the Wisconsin State Law, all ATVs should be registered by the State of Wisconsin, or by another State, to be operated within the State.
    - 7.2.5. ROLLERBLADES, NON-MOTORIZED & MOTORIZED SKATEBOARDS, AND ROLLER SKATES are not permitted on Road America property.
    - 7.2.6. BICYCLES are permitted but may not be ridden in the COMPETITION PADDOCK AREA – this is strictly PROHIBITED.
  - 7.3. **OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON ROAD AMERICA PROPERTY:**

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- 7.3.1. Operators of all motor vehicles **(including golf cars)** must possess a valid state-issued driver's license.
- 7.3.2. At no time is anyone allowed to park in fire lanes. Violators will be towed.
- 7.4. CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IS PROHIBITED BY COMPETITORS IN THE PADDOCK UNTIL AFTER ALL ON-TRACK ACTIVITIES HAVE CONCLUDED FOR THE DAY.**
- 7.5. RACE ENGINES MAY NOT BE RUN WITHOUT ROAD AMERICA PERMISSION:**
  - 7.5.1. Before 8:00 AM weekends (Friday-Sunday) / 8:30 AM weekdays (Monday-Thursday)
  - 7.5.2. After 6:00 PM weekends (Friday-Sunday) / 5:00 PM weekdays (Monday-Thursday)
  - 7.5.3. Lessee must vacate the property by 7:00 PM each day unless prior arrangements made with R/A.
  - 7.5.4. On-Track Operations 8:00 – 6:00 Weekends (Friday-Sunday), 8:30 – 5:00 Weekdays (Monday-Thursday)
  - 7.5.5. When paddock space is in the Campground area, Campground quiet time of 10:00 pm applies. Generators can be used only from 7 am – 10 pm and must not disturb other teams or campers.
- 7.6. ALL VEHICLES OR TENTS REMAINING OVERNIGHT ON ROAD AMERICA PROPERTY MUST HAVE:**
  - 7.6.1. A valid Road America overnight camping permit PROPERLY DISPLAYED, unless the lessee has opted for the unlimited camping option, in which case no permit will need to be displayed.
  - 7.6.2. Overnight stays are not permitted without a formal tent or motor home equipment.
- 7.7. NO PETS ARE ALLOWED ON THE ROAD AMERICA PROPERTY WITHOUT ROAD AMERICA PERMISSION. PETS ALLOWED ON THE PROPERTY MUST EITHER BE:**
  - 7.7.1. Kept within the vehicle with adequate ventilation and fresh drinking water.
  - 7.7.2. Kept under control of a leash.
  - 7.7.3. All pets are the responsibility of the owner. If your pet disrupts or causes harm to another individual, it will be grounds for removal of you and your pet from the facility without a refund.
- 7.8. FIRES, WHEN CONDITIONS PERMIT, MUST:**
  - 7.8.1. Be contained within a device designed for containing a fire.
  - 7.8.2. Be completely extinguished before the coals, ashes, and remains are discarded.
  - 7.8.3. Not be within 10 feet of spectator containment fence or 100 feet of an occupied Road America concession stand or near other competitors' gasoline storage areas.
- 7.9. TRACK ETIQUETTE/ACCESS:**
  - 7.9.1. At NO TIME are vehicles permitted to travel COUNTERCLOCKWISE on the track!
  - 7.9.2. No one is allowed access to the track after operations hours for any reason, i.e., running, walking, etc.
- 7.10. DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY:**
  - 7.10.1. Please do not drive stakes or poles into any asphalt surfaces and do not deface, cut, drive nails into or attach lines or any other objects to trees, bushes, light poles, site signposts or buildings
  - 7.10.2. Do not tamper with electrical facilities or any other facilities on RA property. Fines for destruction of property apply.
  - 7.10.3. RA is not responsible for damage caused by other's actions.
  - 7.10.4. Check voltage in electrical receptacles before using
- 7.11. ILLEGAL DRUGS, FIREWORKS, FIREARMS, ANY TYPE OF EXPLOSIVES ARE NOT ALLOWED ON ROAD AMERICA PROPERTY!**
  - 7.11.1. No drones or unmanned aircraft systems are allowed. Violators in possession or operation at any time will be subject to confiscation of their unmanned aircraft, immediate removal from the property, and further prosecution by Law Enforcement.
- 7.12. VENDING** is not allowed on Road America property without obtaining the proper permit. To obtain such a permit, a vendor fee must be paid. This fee varies per event. Contact Road America for details and prices and to make arrangements.
- 7.13. Road America premises are subject to video surveillance.**
