

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The SCCA strives to ensure that ALL participants in its events and activities enjoy a welcoming environment. The SCCA supports equality of opportunity and treatment for all participants and will make every effort to maintain an environment that is free of harassment, discrimination, and any behavior that interferes with a safe, fun, and exciting experience. A commitment to a welcoming environment and the SCCA Values is expected of all its members and attendees, including drivers, workers, crew, guests, staff, contractors and exhibitors, and other participants at SCCA activities, sessions and social events and when representing the SCCA in print or electronic media.

DRIVER ADVISORY on Forward Facing Cameras: Effective January 1, 2023 "All cars competing at Regionals, Conference Majors, Super Tour events, and the SCCA Runoffs must have a forward-facing camera that is recording at all times while on track and provides a clear horizontal field of view of the cars and track ahead. The cameras may be mounted either inside the car, or on the body. If video is needed as part of an investigation of an incident, a competitor's video of the full unedited session may be requested by race officials regardless of whether or not said competitor was involved in the incident. Failure to provide such video may result in penalties. Forward facing cameras are recommended at all other SCCA-sanctioned events. The video format must be a digital file so it can be viewed in an MS Windows compatible viewer.

SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS

This event is governed by the 2023 General Competition Rules (GCR) and Category Specifications, as amended for 2023 per "Fastrack", except as modified by these Supplemental Regulations

I. REGISTRATION and FEES

- A. TEST DAY: The test day is provided by Texas Region SCCA and covered under SCCA event sanction and insurance.
- **B. ENTRY FEES:** Entry Fee for the two-day weekend is \$550. Second entry with same driver \$400. Each SRF3. SRF, FE2, FE entry will be charged an additional \$30 and each SM an additional \$20 compliance fee per entry for the weekend. The Runoffs Appearance Fund fee (previously known as a tow fund fee) of \$20 will be charged to each Runoffs Eligible Entry.
- C. PAYMENTS & REFUNDS: Online registration is at the following link http://msreg.com/23TXSCCAPolarPrix
 An entry is not considered complete until the proper fee is received. Online registration will close Wednesday Jan 18, 2023 at 11:59 PM. Credit cards will not be processed before Jan 19, 2023. All entries received prior to Jan 5, 2023 at 11:59 PM will receive a \$50 early bird discount as a token of our appreciation.

 A refund will be made if the entry does not go on track. Withdrawal notifications are accepted by email, phone, or in person to the Chief Registrar or via MotorsportReg.com and would be greatly appreciated in advance of the event and no later than noon on Saturday.
- **D. PASSES:** Each entry received five (5) passes total, including the driver and entrant. Workers, guests, & crew must sign for their own passes and must arrive while registration is open. All crew members signing in under a prep shop list must be an SCCA member. Weekend memberships are available for purchase if needed. SCCA members (non-participants) must present a valid membership card for admission.
- E. PADDOCK AND GARAGE RESERVATION: Reservation for Carports may be determined at a later date.
- **F. PREFERRED NUMBERS:** Every effort will be made to honor Conference Preferred Numbers until 14 days prior to the event. However, due to the make-up of the run groups, this may not be possible in all situations. If two drivers holding the same Preferred Number request that number for the same run group, the number will be assigned to the driver with the earliest request.
- **G. PADDOCK/PARKING INFORMATION:** No reserved parking. No parking between/around member garage buildings.

II. DRIVER INFORMATION

- A. **DRIVER ELIGIBILITY:** To participate in this event drivers must be a current member of the SCCA and hold a SCCA Full Competition license. If you do not have the proper credentials it is your responsibility to contact the Registrar prior to the event. If the Race Director allows the substitution of a car or driver, per GCR 5.12.3.A.6, any qualifying times earned for the original car/driver up to that point will be removed.
- B. CAR ELIGIBILITY: Competition is open to all cars conforming to the GCR, as amended.
- **C. TIMING & SCORING:** All cars are required to use fully operational MyLaps (formerly AMB) transponders, and the driver is responsible for providing the correct information to Timing & Scoring. Make sure your transponder





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is on and functioning for ALL SESSIONS. Information gathered from personal timing and data collection systems is unofficial and will not be used by race officials. Cars without working transponders may not receive times

- **D. COURSE:** Motorsport Ranch, 1.7 mile course, Counter-Clockwise.
- E. BLACK FLAG: Pit Lane Exit to Paddock
- **F. SOUND CONTROL:** Sound Limit 103dB, Sound Control Readings will be posted in Tech. Sound Meter Location to be determined at the event and will be posted in Tech.
- **G. WARM-UP SESSIONS/HARDSHIP LAPS:** Competitors who have mechanical problems and need to test their car at speed may be allowed a hardship lap at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
- H. AWARDS: SCCA US Majors Tour Points will be awarded in accordance with the GCR and these Supplemental Regulations. Trophies for all Majors Races (RunOffs Eligible Entries) will be awarded in accordance with the GCR. Southwest Division Road Racing Championship points will be awarded per the current SWRRC Rules and prizes awarded at end of year.

III. CAR SAFETY and TECH INSPECTIONS

- A. DECALS: A US Majors Tour decal must be displayed on both sides of all competition vehicles. Competition vehicles must also display the official SCCA Road Racing decal per GCR Section 9.3.29.C (Figure 4). Stickers will be provided free of charge and may be obtained at registration and/or tech. (The official SCCA Summit Racing Equipment Road Racing decal does not serve as the Summit Racing Equipment contingency program decal.)
- **B. TECH:** No smoking or engines running in the Tech Garage. All drivers without a current year helmet sticker must present all driver gear as required by the GCR and vehicle logbook to Tech. If your car requires an annual tech you must also bring the car to Tech.
- **C. SCALES:** Availability of scales and times will be posted at Tech. Scales may be available for other participants during race impound, but priority will be given to impounded cars. Scales may be made available at other times at the discretion of the Chief of Tech.

IV. QUALIFYING/RACE

A. GRID:

Practice: Starting positions for the first sanctioned, official on-track session will be set based on order of arrival at GRID.

Qualifying: Grid positions will be determined by the order of arrival on GRID.

Saturday Race: Grid position will be determined using the fastest lap time in the Saturday Qualifying session. **Sunday Race:** Grid positions will be determined by the fastest lap time recorded for each car during any of the preceding qualifying session(s) or the fastest lap during the Saturday race.

V. IMPOUND

- A. MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETING: Either a written Drivers' Meeting from Chief Steward may be emailed to all entrants/drivers in advance of the event, or an <u>Impound All</u> will be given at the end of the first Qualifying session for each group to conduct a driver's meeting. Impound will be in the Tech Area. Look for the signs for proper direction.
- **B. SPLIT STARTS:** Drivers may request a split start after the Saturday qualifying session. The Chief Steward will approve a split start only if the majority of drivers in a session are in favor.
- C. IMPOUND: The top three finishers in each class shall report to impound immediately following the completion of their race, for both Saturday and Sunday races, for post-race inspection per the pre-approved tech plan. Drivers are not required to report to Impound after their qualifying sessions unless directed to do so by the Black Flag Steward. The Chief Steward will be available in impound at the conclusion of each Qualifying and Race session for questions, clarifications or discussion of on-track incidents.
- **D. CONTACT:** GCR Section 6.11.1.E requires that the driver and car, involved in significant body contact, to stop at the designated incident investigation site for review of the incident by stewards. "Significant body contact" includes but is not limited to: contact resulting in 2 or 4 wheels off course, spins, loss of position, or repairs to the suspension or bodywork. Drivers shall satisfy this requirement by reporting to the Black Flag Steward





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located on the pit lane at the track exit to the grid area. Drivers who do not satisfy this requirement will be referred to the Stewards of the Meeting (SOM).

VI. GENERAL

- A. RACE LENGTH: Saturday races will be 20 minutes. Sunday races will be 45 miles. When the LAST LAP INDICATOR is given at Start/Finish, the next flag will be a checkered flag. In the case of a long delay and where the time limit has expired, the Chief Steward may convert to laps to allow a green, white, checker to complete the race.
- **B. RESULTS:** Live timing will be available during the event through <u>Race Monitor</u>, and may be available at <u>SCCA.com</u>. Live timing information is neither official nor protestable. Results will only be available at <u>TX Region Road Racing</u> or by using the QR code at the end of these supplemental regulations.
- C. EVENT SCHEDULE/RUN GROUPS: Actual session start times may be delayed from the published schedule due to unforeseen circumstances during the event. It is the driver's responsibility to listen to the PA system and pay attention to activity on track. The schedule or run groups may only be changed (or start times advanced) at the discretion of the Chief Steward, with concurrence by the Event Chair, depending on pre-race entry counts or as needed to accommodate situations during the event.
- **D. CANCELLATION:** If part of an event is canceled for reasons of safety or forces beyond our control as provided by GCR Appendix B.1.2.B., points will be awarded based on race grids.
- **E. CLOTHING:** Safe apparel must be worn in the pits at all times. Crew members on pit lane must display their event credential at all times while on pit lane.
- **F. GRID:** All motorized vehicles (race cars and support vehicles) must enter the grid area from the designated traffic flow signage.
- G. PIT LANE: Drivers are to maintain a safe speed on Pit Lane with absolutely no racing.

- I. FUEL PROVIDER: Available at Track SUNOCO (formerly Texaco)

VII. TRACK RULES

- A. Gates close on the track immediately after the last scheduled run session. The track is considered cold, and no person is allowed to enter without express consent from MSR.
- B. Only MSR personnel may open and close the track gates prior to and after an event.
- C. No alcohol consumption is allowed while track is in use by anyone on the grounds in the facility.
- D. No one under the age of eighteen is permitted to operate a motorized vehicle unless they are registered with the event.
- E. Speed limit in the paddock is 15 mph.
- F. No parking between and around garage buildings.
- G. Do not leave used tires at our facility, take them with you or pay a disposal fee at one of the shops on site.
- H. Dispose of used oil in the waste oil container on site. Ask at the front desk for location.
- I. In the case of rain or mud, all vehicles must stay on pavement.
- J. Animals must remain on leash at all times, must be cleaned up after and not allowed in the clubhouse.
- K. No spectators beyond the posted limits on the grounds.
- L. Camping is allowed, however, the contracted sanctioned renting party is responsible for operational security on the grounds during closed hours, if they have registered drivers staying on the grounds. Gates MUST be closed at 10:00 PM and opened no earlier than 6:00 AM by the sanctioned group renting the property
- M. Be safe and have fun!

VIII. OTHER

- A. LOCATIONS: **Registration** will be located upstairs in the Club House. **Tech** and **Impound** will be located under the canopy on the north side of the Club House. **Race Control** will be located upstairs in the Club House.
- B. The Race Chairman, Chief Steward, Stewards of the Meeting, and other race officials will normally be located in the Club House or at Impound.





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- C. Competitors who have mechanical problems and need to test their race car at speed may be allowed a hardship lap at the discretion of the Chief Steward.
- D. Majors Trophies will be awarded after each race in the Tech Area. SWRRC Trophies are awarded on an annual championship basis and will be awarded at the end of the season

IX. OTHER PROVISIONS

- A. The Chief Steward and Stewards of the Meeting reserve the right to combine or split race groups and to modify the schedule and/or length of sessions as may be required.
- B. A Checkered Flag may be displayed at the Black Flag station to indicate the end of a practice or qualifying session. During practice, drivers must proceed directly to the pits. During Qualifying and Races drivers may opt to run a cool down lap after being shown the checkered Flag.
- C. Flag Station 7 will Start and Flag the Race from the back straight. The Checkered Flag will be thrown from Flag Station 1 at the end of the front straight before Turn 1.
