



## 2022 "Hyler Craft Memorial" Driver's School February 25/26, 2022 Roebling Road Raceway - Supplemental Regulations Sanction #: 22-DS-57066

**Welcome!** The SCCA strives to ensure that ALL participants in its events and activities enjoy a welcoming environment. The SCCA supports equality of opportunity and treatment for all participants, regardless of gender, gender identity or expression, race, color, national or ethnic origin, religion or religious belief, age, marital status, sexual orientation, disabilities, or veteran status. NOTICE TO PARTICIPANTS: In light of the current COVID-19 situation, every attempt will be made to minimize the risks of exposure to the virus. New processes and procedures are being developed and will be put into place for events going forward.

Ultimately, it is your responsibility to assess the risk to you, both on-track and off, and to make the decision on whether or not to participate. If you are feeling unwell or are experiencing symptoms such as temperature of 100.4f, cough, or shortness of breath please stay home. If you have been in contact with someone who has been experiencing these symptoms in the last two weeks, please stay home.

While on site please take the health and safety of your fellow participants, volunteers and staff into consideration and practice social distancing, wear a mask, and wash your hands and/or use hand sanitizer frequently.

All attendees and participants are reminded to be respectful of others and follow these guidelines. We recommend you wear face coverings sufficient to cover their nose and mouth and to adhere to social distancing guidelines at all times while on the track property. Those individuals not adhering to these guidelines or whatever other requirements that may be imposed, will be given a warning to comply and if continues to be non-compliant may be asked to leave the facility.

If you are diagnosed with COVID-19 within two (2) weeks of attending an SCCA event, we ask that you cancel your registration.

<u>DRIVER'S ELIGIBILITY</u>: All drivers who hold a valid SCCA Novice Permit who are members of SCCA. You must contact the SCCA national office (800-770-2055) to obtain your Novice Permit in advance of the event. You must complete the SCCA on-line driver's course prior to attending the weekend. Bring a printed copy of your completion certificate with you. (See instructions on motorsportreg.com for login information) Drivers who successfully complete the school will be eligible to register for the SARRC club race on Sunday, and will receive a \$50 discount. Required SCCA and SARRC patches & stickers are available in tech. STUDENTS THAT INTEND TO RACE SUNDAY MUST ATTEND THE DRIVER'S MEETING ON SATURDAY.

<u>VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY</u>: All SCCA and SEDIV recognized classes with a current SCCA logbook. Shared entries must be closed wheel cars. We encourage all vehicles to have the annual inspections, or new logbooks issued BEFORE they arrive for this event. Annual inspections may be done when Tech opens on Thursday. ALL CLASSES MAY BE required to remove the fire system bottle for inspection and weighing. Master switches and tow hooks will be checked as well, so please come prepared. Required SCCA and SARRC patches and stickers are available in tech.

<u>REGISTRATION:</u> The entry fee is \$425. Register online at <u>www.motorsportreg.com</u>. If you don't already have an account with motorsportreg, you must first create your account and then click on the event to register. Please make sure to download or print the supplementary regulations and schedule for your use. CREDIT/DEBIT CARDS ONLY WILL ACCEPTED, NO CHECKS OR CASH. Your credit/debit card will be charged when you check-in at the track. No refunds after the driver/car have entered pit road or the track. Contact the Registrar during registration hours to request a refund. If you don't have access to the internet, please contact the event registrar. Entries must be completed online by February 24, 2022 to avoid a \$100.00 late fee.

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DO NOT PARK OR BLOCK THE PUBLIC ROADS ENTERING THE TRACK. Park in the lot next to Registration.

<u>GATE HOURS:</u> Thursday noon to Sunday 7:00 PM. Entry to the Facility will only be by Gate Passes issued to each person at Registration. <u>ANYONE ENTERING THE TRACK BEFORE REGISTRATION OPENS OR AFTER REGISTRATION CLOSES MUST GO TO REGISTRATION BY 8:30 AM THE FOLLOWING DAY.</u>

<u>PASSES:</u> Each entry is entitled to four passes, plus driver and entrant. Crew members who are not SCCA members will be required to purchase a weekend membership at registration to gain access to the track side of the pit fence. Only three crew members will be allowed on the track side of the pit fence. Membership cards must be presented at registration in order to enter the facility. Members and race staff are limited to one guest each.

**START/FINISH:** Start and Finish of races is at the Tower on the front straight. Timing and Scoring is located in the Tower on the front straight. All laps are timed and scored at the Start/Finish line.

<u>CHECKERED FLAG/BLACK FLAG:</u> The checkered flag will be displayed at START/FINISH LINE ending qualifying sessions and races and at Turn 6 for practice sessions. Black Flags will be shown both at Turn 6 and Start/Finish with a number board.

**SCALES**: Will be available at Tech from 1PM – 8PM Thursday, 8AM - noon and 1PM- 8PM on Friday and 1PM-8PM on Saturday. Scales will not be available for other participants during any impound time periods.

<u>GRID:</u> Cars not in position at the one-minute warning shall relinquish their positions and start at the back of the field. No <u>Smoking in the Grid area.</u>

<u>CAR NUMBERS:</u> Numbers and class designation shall be placed and sized according to the GCR. No car number changes at the track after the event starts, except under direction of Timing and Scoring and Registration. Car swaps or borrowed car will incur an additional \$125 fee to cover insurance and track fees. Car numbers are assigned on a first come, first registered basis.

<u>TRANSPONDERS:</u> MyLaps Transponders will be required. Contact Trackside Tim in advance at 803-732-0937, <a href="mailto:www.tracksidetim.com">www.tracksidetim.com</a> or <a href="mailto:Tim@tracksidetim.com">Tim@tracksidetim.com</a>. New transponders subscription-based devices must be activated before the event.

<u>IMPOUND:</u> All cars will be impounded after the 10-lap race. The Chief Steward may require additional inspections. Impound is at the tech shed across from Start/Finish line. No Smoking in tech or impound area.

<u>RESULTS/TROPHIES:</u> Provisional only results for the 10-lap races, if available, will be posted on the bulletin board at the entry to the Paddock. No trophies or prizes will be awarded for this event.

<u>FACILITIES</u>: Concession, souvenirs, and restrooms with hot water showers are located in the paddock. Camping is permitted on Friday and Saturday nights. The Track Manager must approve camping on Sunday night. 30 Amp and 50 Amp electrical hookups are available for \$25 per day per cord. 110V electrical hookups are available for \$10 per day per cord. Camping in RV, Trailers or 18 wheelers is \$25 per night (includes electric), tent camping \$10 per night. A sticker will be issued when you pay for electrical hookup, it must be displayed on the cord. Contact the Track Manager at 888-398-7223 for more information. Sunoco unleaded 93, 98, and 110 leaded are available at the track. DEBIT/CREDIT CARDS are the <u>only</u> payment accepted for fuel. DEBIT/CREDIT CARDS are now accepted at the concession stand and tee-shirt shack.

<u>COMMUNICATIONS:</u> Race Control uses digital radios 461.825, 461.025 and 464.100 MHz. For the safety of competitors and race staff, failure to keep these frequencies clear will result in immediate action under rights specified in the GCR. **Do not use these frequencies for personal communication**. Race Communications will be re-broadcast on FM 101.5.

**SOUND CONTROL:** Sound readings will be posted on the bulletin board at paddock entry. The maximum allowable reading is 103 Decibels (GCR 5.7). Sound control is located on drivers left just past Start/Finish. After two readings in a session, car will be black flagged, and the Operating Steward must approve any changes to the car before re-entering the track.

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**COURSE**: Roebling Road Raceway is a 2.02-mile road racing course located just outside Bloomingdale, Georgia.

## ADDITIONAL RULES OF THE PIT AND PADDOCK

- 1. Crew may not stand by the white outer pit wall unless signaling a driver. Absolutely no sitting on the inner blue wall. **ARM BANDS FOR THE HOT PITS MUST BE VISIBLE AT ALL TIMES!**
- 2. No parallel parking allowed along the pit/grid fence. No vehicles are allowed between the concrete wall and the fence.
- 3. Pit support motorized vehicles (ATV's, golf carts, mopeds, motorcycles) may only be operated by a person with a valid driver's license and used for race support only. Car # must be displayed on support vehicle at all times. Unauthorized or dangerous use of these vehicles (speeding greater than 5 mph, joy riding, double riding etc.) will result in the vehicle being impounded and responsible driver being reported to the Chief Steward. No support vehicles may be used after 8 PM. No miniature ATV's or Motorcycles of any kind.
- 4. Minors under 16 will not be permitted to operate any vehicle including bicycles.
- 5. PLEASE avoid parking in the grid access lanes, the roadway behind the concession building, or vendor assigned spaces in the paddock area. Failure to move from any of these areas when requested may result in disqualification. All single car open trailers must be moved to the parking area located at the East end of the infield paddock. Please do not jack up cars on paved access roads. Concrete areas are provided under the tech shed and, in the paddock, to allow putting cars on jack stands for leveling suspensions and other maintenance issues.
- 6. Entrants must have a fire bottle displayed in their paddock area with a minimum rating of 10ABC. **THIS IS A GEORGIA STATE LAW.**
- 7. No alcoholic beverage consumption anywhere on site permitted until the last car is off the track at the end of race day. (Not just YOUR group.)
- 8. Pets must be kept on a leash at all times. An adult shall control pets at all times. Leashes may not exceed ten (10) feet in length. Owners are required to pick up and dispose of pet's wastes. Do not walk pet without a visible means to pick up and dispose of pet's waste.
- 9. Local ordinance prohibits the running of race engines between 8 PM and 8 AM and from 11 AM to 12 Noon on Sunday. (\$100 FINE for non -compliance.)
- 10. Two sound violations (measured sound over 103 dB limit) will result in removal of the car from the track. Drivers will be allowed the opportunity to repair the problem causing the over sound violation and re-enter or withdraw without penalty.
- 11. Track rules are posted and will be enforced during this event.
