This event is governed by the current General Competition Rules (GCR) and Category Specifications, as amended by FasTrack
Track Event portions of this event are governed by the current Track Event Rules.

Close of Entries: Wednesday, April 23, 2025, or as extended by registration officials
Early Bird Discount: \$25-Majors, \$20-Regional automatically applied on MsReg until 2 weeks prior to close of entries

ENTRY FEES:

- Competition Driver School \$300 (Friday and Saturday)
- Student Sunday Regional Add On \$175 (Sunday Only for School Graduates)
- Regional Weekend: \$395 (Saturday and Sunday)
\$300 for 2nd Entry / Double Dip
- Regional Single Day: \$275 (Saturday or Sunday)
- Enterprises Compliance (SRF, SRF3, FE, FE2): \$30 / per entry

- A. Double Dip: A driver wishing to register with additional cars or in multiple classes. Applies to each additional registration. Driver agrees to comply with the published groupings and group order. Please use the double dip option at the time of registration.
B. A change in any entry after the start of the event requires re-registering and may involve additional fees.
C. Spectator entry at La Junta is FREE

If you need help registering, please contact the race chair or the registrar.

- A. Online registration will close at midnight of the Wednesday before the event unless extended by registration officials.
B. Event payments will be processed through MSReg at the time of check-in at the track. A \$50.00 fee will be assessed on returned checks.
C. Registration check-in will be held in Registration/Hospitality, located in the classroom building. All drivers, volunteers, and officials must check in to complete registration and receive credentials, even if they have signed an annual SCCA waiver.
D. Cancellations shall be made through the Chief Registrar before the event. Once the event is complete, refund requests must be made to the region treasurer teri.massey@comcast.net within 7 calendar days following the event.
E. In the event of mechanical failure, refunds will be considered by the Chief Registrar and Chief of T & S for cars that have not been on the racing surface. Requests must be submitted to the Chief Registrar before the end of the event.
F. Approved refunds will be issued via MSReg.
G. Only members holding a current SCCA membership may be credentialed for the hot areas. Weekend memberships can be purchased at registration, during posted hours, for a fee of \$15.00.

DRIVER ELIGIBILITY: Drivers must have a current SCCA membership and a current SCCA Full Competition License or SCCA Novice Permit. Additional licenses that are accepted include an SCCA Pro License, SCCA Vintage License, or any organization's license that is currently approved by SCCA for competition as listed in the GCR, Appendix C, 2.8.B (pages 105 & 106). [Download GCR](#). Proper credentials must be presented at check-in.

CAR ELIGIBILITY: This competition is open to all cars conforming to the GCR, as amended.

- A. Colorado Region also recognizes Regional and Spec Classes specific to the Rocky Mountain Division as follows: Club Ford (CF), Club Formula Continental (CC), Club Vee (CV), ITE Everything (ITE-0, ITE-U), Spec RX-7 (S7), Spec 7 with 13B (Pro 7), and Regional Spec Miata (RSM). - A. Obtain an SCCA Legal Race Car with current Annual Tech Inspection.
B. Register for the school at coloradoscca.motorsportreg.com.
C. Complete SCCA Online Drivers' School Course –
• Go to SCCA.com and Log In
• Select SCCA MEMBERS (red box) to enter your account portal
• Under "My Learning" click on "Course Registration"
• Scroll to bottom, find SCCA Drivers' School modules
• Complete Modules 1 and 2 before class

E. Also at <https://www.coloradoscca.org/racing/>, download and complete the GCR Exam and Flag Test. Bring your answers to class.

DRIVER SCHOOL GRADUATES ENTERING THE SUNDAY REGIONAL: Driver school graduates whose Novice Permits have been signed off and wish to compete in the Sunday Regional races, must return to Registration on Saturday to complete the registration process for an additional one-day entry.



COMPETITION NUMBERS: Preference will be given to numbers assigned through the Rocky Mountain Division numbering program. Unreserved numbers are on a first-come, first-served basis. All numbering assignments are subject to race group configurations.

TECHNICAL INSPECTION: Tech inspection hours are posted on the event schedule.

- A. Express Tech is available for drivers with both a current annual tech and a current year helmet sticker. Drivers should bring their vehicle logbook and registration credential to get their event stickers.
- B. Drivers without a current year helmet sticker must present all driver gear as required by the GCR, vehicle logbook, and registration credential to Tech. If your car requires an annual tech, you must also bring the car to tech. An event tech sticker will be issued after everything is examined and approved.
- C. The inspection order of priority at the track will be:
 1. Express Tech
 2. Re-inspection, logbook notation
 3. Annual inspection or cars with no logbook (new or lost logbooks)
- D. Competitors needing annual inspections or new logbooks must make prior arrangements with the Chief of Tech to have these items performed by tech personnel at the track.
- E. All cars are required to have a forward-facing camera that is recording consistently while on track and provides a clear horizontal field of view of the cars and track ahead (GCR 9.3.11.A.) Scrutineers have been requested to report any cars without the required camera as non-compliant to the stewards.

SCALES: Scales will be available each day from 8 AM until the end of the competition, except during impound.

- A. Driving on or off the scales is prohibited unless otherwise instructed by Tech personnel.
 1. Motors must be turned off and competitors and/or crew must push cars on and off scales.
- B. If Tech personnel instruct you to drive onto the scales:
 1. Proceed gently with minimal acceleration and braking forces, which can damage the scale pads.
 2. Follow the tech personnel's instructions regarding left to right alignment and where to stop.

EVENT SCHEDULE / RUN GROUPS: The course configuration for this event will be Clockwise. The event schedule or run groups may be changed at the discretion of the Chief Steward. If changes are made, as much notice as possible will be given to all competitors.

- A. The schedule as published is for planning purposes. Session start times may vary from the published schedule as the event progresses.
- B. The clock for practice and qualifying starts with cars on course, per the session start times indicated on the schedule. The official clock for races starts when the first car crosses the start/finish line at the end of the pace lap.

TIMING AND SCORING: All cars are required to use fully operational MyLaps (formerly AMB) transponders, and the driver is responsible for providing correct information during registration. Unless otherwise announced, live timing will be available via the Race Monitor App and Speedhive.

- A. Non-operational transponders or missing transponder information may not be scored for the event.
 - a. A limited number of transponders may be available for rent at the rate of \$30.00 per day, along with a \$500 retainer on a valid credit card.
 - b. A competitor needing a rental unit should make those arrangements at the time of entry submission.
- B. The clock will continue to run during all flag conditions, except for the red flag.
- C. Personal timing beacons are not allowed within 20 feet of the T & S system, or across track from start/finish.

GRID: Each day, the Starting positions for Race 1 will be based on the practice/qualifying session immediately preceding the race.

- Saturday – Race 2 will be an inverted grid, based on the finishing order from Race 1.
 - Sunday – Race 2 will be an inverted grid, based on the finishing order from Race 1.
Race 3 grid will be based on the finishing order from Race 2.
- A. Crew / Guests must leave the grid at the one-minute warning.
 - B. Drivers are prohibited from scrubbing tires in the paddock, grid, pit out to the course and hot pit lane.

SPLIT STARTS: The Chief Steward will consider requests for split starts and may authorize such based on qualifying times.

DESIGNATED INCIDENT INVESTIGATION SITE: If a driver is involved in significant body contact, the driver and car shall proceed to the designated incident investigation site for review of the incident by the stewards before going to their paddock area. Significant body contact includes but is not limited to: Contact resulting in 2 or 4 wheels off course, spins, loss of position, or damage to suspension or bodywork. The designated incident investigation site is in Tech/Impound.

DISABLED CARS: Disabled or damaged cars may be removed from the course and delivered to a central location. If the car has sustained body/chassis damage it will be taken to impound and will be released to the driver/crew after tech has made appropriate notations in the vehicle log book. Cars disabled due to a mechanical failure will be released to the driver/crew immediately. If the car requires wrecker support to return to its paddock location, there may be a delay depending on the availability of wreckers or flat tows.

RESULTS & AWARDS: Qualifying, provisional, and final results will be posted at Registration/Hospitality. Additionally, final results will be posted to the Colorado Region website no later than 7 days following the completion of the event.

- A. Trophies for Feature Races (#2 on Saturday, #3 on Sunday) will be awarded in accordance with the GCR, and will be available in the Hospitality Area. Sunday trophies will be available until one hour after the last checkered flag.
- B. Trophies not picked up will be considered forfeited unless prior arrangements have been made with the Race Chairman.

FLAGGING:

- A. GCR 6.1 flag rules apply to all sessions
- B. BLACK FLAG station is at corner station 6
- C. For practice sessions, a CHECKERED FLAG signaling the end of the session may be displayed at BOTH Start/Finish AND Corner 6. Cars receiving the checkered flag at Corner 6 must proceed directly to the pit lane/paddock.
- D. Last lap will be indicated by a waving white flag at start/finish.

SOUND CONTROL: A maximum of 103dB is in effect for this event. Sound will be located on the front straight, drivers left, midway between Start/Finish and Turn 1. Sound readings will be posted at Hospitality.

RADIO FREQUENCIES: The region frequencies below shall not be used for communications by any participant.

PADDOCK:

- A. Access ways for general paddock traffic and emergency vehicles must be always kept clear or vehicles will be towed.
- B. You must have a valid motor vehicle license to operate any 2, 3, or 4-wheeled motorized or non-motorized vehicles in the paddock.
- C. Skateboards, skates, rollerblades, and one-wheel electric boards are prohibited.
- D. The paddock speed limit is 10 M.P.H. Vehicles in the paddock must be operated in a safe manner.
- E. Entrants are responsible for the conduct of their crew, guests, minors, and pets. All minors must always be under direct adult supervision. Pets in the paddock must be always leashed and under the direct supervision of an adult.
- F. Minors and non-members must remain behind any barrier paralleling the hot pit lane. No one will be allowed to view from in front of the race control and timing structure.

GENERAL: Participants must always display proper credentials.

- A. The organizers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the event, or any part of the event. Entry fees will be refunded to those offered no opportunity to compete.
- B. Vendors wishing to display or sell any items must obtain prior approval from the race chair.
- C. Consumption of alcohol is prohibited until after the daily on track activities are concluded. In addition, GCR 2.3.1.B shall be in effect as it relates to Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs.
- D. The organizers reserve the right to refuse entry and/or issuance of credentials to the premises or event for any reason except race, color, creed, sex, or national origin.
- E. Unmanned aerial vehicles, also known as drones, shall not be used anywhere in the airspace over the property.
- F. All on track body contact (including contact during drafting) that causes a car to act erratically and results in a change of position or a car leaving the course will be investigated.

Test and Tune: The track will be open for Test and Tune on Thursday April 24, 2025 from 10am to 4pm. Please contact the Track Manager, Allan Lasater at Allan@lajuntaraceway.net for pricing and information.

Please Note: Any Open Lapping, Test Day, or Session not on the official schedule are NOT sanctioned by SCCA and are NOT covered by SCCA Insurance.

Race Fuel: The only fuel available on the track property is offered at La Junta Municipal Airport with a self-serve pump (credit card only). Loaf n Jug is about 2.5 miles south of the track.

Directions to La Junta Raceway: La Junta Raceway is on Route 109 (Main Street) about four miles north of US-50 in the Airport Industrial Park. Enter at the main Industrial Park entrance (Harris Ave.). Turn left onto Otero Avenue. Turn left again in about 1/3 mile. Turn right on Railroad Avenue and proceed to the track entrance, on the left.

Accommodations: RVs may be parked overnight at the track. A limited number of electrical hookups are available for rent. Hookups are First Come, First Served, by pre-arrangement with the Track Manager, Allan Lasater at Allan@lajuntaraceway.net.

Volunteer Incentives: Volunteers are needed for Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Volunteers are required to pre-register on MSReg, so arrangements can be made for lunches, Saturday night dinner / party, etc. For help with registration, please contact the Race Chairman or Registrar.

- A. A lunch ticket will be given to each volunteer for each day worked
- B. Volunteers are invited to participate in one Free TT session on Saturday and Sunday. Sessions should be coordinated with each worker's specialty chief and the TT Event Lead.
- C. Volunteers will receive accommodations reimbursement for 1 – 3 nights, depending on the number of days worked. Volunteers are required to book their own accommodation. The region will reimburse ½ of the accommodation rate per volunteer. Share with another volunteer and get 100% reimbursement. The maximum amount of reimbursement will be based on the nightly rate at the **preferred hotel**, though volunteers are not required to stay at one of the preferred hotels. Please present the paid receipt to the Race Chairman before the end of the event. The Region Treasurer will mail reimbursement immediately after the event.
