Registration and entry information:

Registration opens **May 6, 2026 at 6:00 PM eastern time**. The first 90 qualified entrants will be accepted.

Entry fee(s):

Prepaid: \$350 (If received postmarked before June 12)

Late entry fee: \$425 (If submitted on or after June 12)

Weekend membership: \$ 25 (If not a current SCCA member)

Refunds and fees:

Prepaid entries canceled before **June 12th** will receive a full refund.

Late entries will be charged at registration, and there will be a \$35 fee charged for any check returned by the bank.

General information and supplemental regulations

Driver licensing and eligibility

Drivers must:

1. Have a current full membership of the SCCA
2. Have a valid state-issued driver's license
3. Be able to handle the physical and mental demands of competition for the length of a session for each session of the event
4. Either possess a current SCCA Hillclimb Driver License **or** complete the novice orientation process at the event.

Minor drivers (less than 18 years old)

In addition to the above, minor drivers:

1. Must contact event officials before the event
2. Must provide a completed SCCA minor waiver (form 1068)
3. Attendance of the novice HillClimb program, novice coaching, and working with a mentor is required.

Novice drivers

Drivers who have not participated in a Hillclimb event are required to attend the novice HillClimb program, participate in novice coaching, and work with a mentor. There will be a hill orientation on Friday at 2:00 PM (sharp). Please arrive at the expo center on time, and be prepared to ride up the hill in one of a few provided pickup trucks, exploring the need-to-knows of the hill. While a 7:00 AM Saturday huddle is available for those with unavoidable conflicts, the Friday 2:00 PM session is the comprehensive orientation and is strongly encouraged for all novices.

Vehicle eligibility

The event is open to automobiles (no motorcycles, karts, ATVs or similar) which meet the following criteria:

1. Vehicle must have at least four (4) wheels, grouped in equal sets of half of the wheels on the vehicle per side.
2. Vehicle must be properly muffled.
3. Vehicle must not have a high center of gravity. Potentially unstable vehicles with a high center of gravity (determined by whether they are wider than they are tall) are excluded from SCCA Time Trials. Width is the average track width of the vehicle, and height is measured from the ground to the highest point. Extra caution should be exercised with non-traditional vehicles (e.g., trucks using racing slicks or tires with less than 200 tread wear rating).

Minimum safety equipment

This event requires that all vehicles meet the SCCA HillClimb “safety level 2” at a minimum. This includes an approved Snell SA2015, SA2020, or SA2025 helmet, at least a 4-point roll bar constructed to SCCA specifications, an approved racing harness, racing suit, shoes, gloves, and other items like arm restraints or window nets and fire suppression devices/systems. Factory safety systems (like you might find at a track day or time trial) are not considered appropriate. <https://timetrials.scca.com/pages/hillclimb-safety-rules>

Tech inspection

All competition vehicles must be properly registered for the event and pass tech safety equipment inspection at the expo center. Those with annual techs need only bring their logbook. Those without annual techs will need to bring their car, their logbook, and their safety gear. Tech opens in the paddock at noon and closes shortly before the fanfest starts. If time does not permit tech to complete your vehicle, tech is available from 7:00 AM Saturday morning. Please have tech completed before the driver’s meeting. Please bring your logbook if you have one to the tech inspector, and some cash if you don’t have one as one will need to be issued.

Numbers and class designation

Numbers and class designation must be visible on both sides of the vehicle, will be issued on a first-come/first-serve basis or through the annual permanent number registration (available at <https://tinyurl.com/2026AHSPN>) and must meet the following criteria:

1. Numbers must be minimum 8” tall
2. Two-driver cars should add "1" to the primary driver's number (e.g., first driver 59, second driver 159)
3. All competition vehicles must display the issued Appalachian Hillclimb Series class designation sticker during competition runs.

Competition classes

Awards and records

The following awards will be given for class performance:

1. The top 3 finishers in each AHS class will receive trophies.
2. King or Queen of the Hill (Overall fastest time)
3. King or Queen of the Hill (Fastest driver not matching the gender of the overall fastest time award)

Flag Rock Hillclimb records are kept for class and overall performance awards. For a record to be set, at least two cars must have run in the history of the class.

Running order and number of runs

1. There will be a minimum of two Run groups. Run groups and run order will be announced at the event.
2. Two driver cars will run in separate groups.
3. Only runs available to all competitors in AHS class will be eligible for awards. The event leads have discretion to allow additional runs to stand as records, provided all competitors present within 2 seconds of the standing record are given the option to run

4. While event management will do all we can to notify drivers, it is the driver's responsibility to know when their group is on call. Unless the missed runs are due to event organizer error or other circumstances beyond the driver's control, missed runs will not be made up.

Official timing

Timing will be passive and no actions will be required by the driver for times to be scored. The Chief of Timing is Krystal Diandra.

Fuel and fueling

Standard pump gas is available around Noirton. Race fuel is not available onsite or nearby. A minimum 10 lb ABC fire extinguisher is required to be present any time fuel is being transferred.

Additional event rules

1. Other than mentors on parade lap(s), passengers are not permitted on official runs
2. Drivers must attend the daily driver's meetings. Driver's meetings will be at the Expo Center. If a driver misses the driver's meeting for any reason, they are required to see the Competition Director or Event Lead before being allowed to compete
3. The requirements for conduct and sportsmanship as defined in the SCCA Time Trials Rules will be strictly enforced. (<https://timetrials.scca.com/pages/tt-basics>)
4. All participants, crew, officials, workers, spectators and guests will adhere to all applicable city, county, state and federal laws and regulations, will follow all rules and regulations listed herein, added, posted at the event or otherwise communicated, and shall not engage in any illegal, immoral, or unsafe activities or business while on the event site.
5. Active tire warming devices are prohibited.

Parking and paddock

1. Paddock spaces for Flag Rock Hillclimb are plentiful. While there is room for everyone, please help us make best use of the space available by bringing the smallest rig you have available. If you have a trailer or RV longer than 28', you will likely be placed in more remote areas of the paddock. Open trailers should be parked at the direction of the paddock marshal.
2. Friday check-in and staging will happen at Expo Center in Norton. Navigate to 115 8th St SW, Norton, VA 24273. You should proceed east down Park Avenue NW, turn right on Coeburn Ave SW, and turn an immediate right onto Mkt Pl SW. Follow Mkt Pl SW west and enter the paddock, along the railroad tracks just east of the Norton Expo Center.
3. Paddock spaces will be directed by Paddock Marshals
4. Workers will park in the gravel parking lot at Reservoir Road off of Route 619S.
5. Support Vehicles - You will likely be limited to no more than one support vehicle (truck, trailer, or RV) per entered race car. Please reach out to the Paddock Marshall ASAP for special needs.
6. Transporters, RVs, trucks and enclosed trailers taking up multiple paddock spaces may be required to share paddock space for other race cars. Assume one race car for every 25 linear feet. Late entries or oversized vehicles may be parked in remote areas of the paddock
7. Movement to the start line from the paddock will be under police escort. Please follow safely, and bear in mind that others in the area may not be aware of what is going on. Maintain safe gaps, but avoid excessive gaps.

8. Remote parking for trailers - Any non-support critical (i.e. open deck, extremely large, or trailers not used in the run-by-run servicing of the car should be parked at the direction of the paddock marshal.

Course and paddock map

The course runs a portion of State Park Road 619, from near Legion Park for 1.75 miles, to a point near the Upper Norton Reservoir Parking (altitude 1850'). The course includes ~15 turns and an elevation gain of 920 feet. All event activity will be within the city limits of Norton, Virginia.

All traffic will be strictly controlled from and including the Legion Park to Upper Norton Reservoir Parking.

5:00 PM - Fanfest in downtown Norton.

TBD - Novice worker classroom

9:45 PM – 6:45 AM - Quiet hours in the paddock. The paddock will remain open, but no race Engines may run. No camping within Norton, VA.
(no camping tents, no camp showers, no campfires, no sleeping outside.)
You are not required to leave the paddock overnight.

*** Race cars and race traffic will be allowed on course at a safe speed and in the right lane only. PLEASE be aware of workers, emergency personnel, fire trucks filling barriers, and other vehicles.**

**** This item is required attendance for novices.**

***** Tech Inspection will be at the tech station at the expo center. Cars will not be inspected until the car's drivers are registered.**

8:30 AM – 9:15 AM - Parade laps - (both lanes up, right lane down. NOT AT RACE SPEED)

9:15 AM - HILL CLEAR

9:30 AM – 5:00 PM - Competition runs

5:30 PM - Road open to two axle vehicles.
