All races (other than V/H) will be 50 laps (100 miles) in length, or 80 minutes, whichever comes first.

The Spec Miata Challenge (SMC) Race will be 15 laps in length or 30 minutes, whichever comes first. The Grid will be created from the times set by SM cars in qualifying for Group 1. Any Spec Miata **cars running in Sunday's Group 6 (only) as an ITA classed car will** be eligible for the SMC. The drivers in Group 6 are to report to the Event Chief Steward to request to be added to the back of the grid. All cars in the SMC must conform to all MCSCC Spec Miata regulations (i.e. weight, restrictor size, tires, etc.).

The Group 4 Race will be run in two parts, each 25 laps or 40 minutes, whichever comes first. The Grid for the second half will be determined by the finishing position in the first half.

SREN, CSRF, and SRF cars wanting to enter two races should enter as UNR3 (in Group 3).

Annual Tech is accepted for all cars. Cars may be randomly selected for inspection.

Supplemental Regulations For the 2019, "That Loooong Race":

1.0. General Event Regulations

- This event is sanctioned by the Midwestern Council of Sports Car Clubs, and insurance conforms to MCSCC requirements. This event will be held under the MCSCC General Competition Regulations, Track Regulations and all Supplemental Regulations. 1.1.
- Trivers are responsible for notifying crew and guests of the hours Registra-tion is open. Entry may not be available beyond posted hours. 1.2.
- 1.3. Minor guests must be under adult supervision at all times
- 1.4. A slow and safe speed shall be maintained in the paddock at all times. Rid-
- No intoxicants may be consumed by drivers, crew or guests before the end of the last race or other on-track activity. There may be General Admission spectators not registered with event sponsors which are not subject to this 1.5. rule.
- 1.6. No illegal drugs or controlled substance shall be tolerated on the track prem-
- Any and all protests, questions or complaints against any competitor's car or driving or against any race specialty should be made to the Event Chief Steward or his/her designated assistant as stipulated in the GCR. In no case 1.7.
- should complaints be directed to any race worker in any specialty. All race support vehicles (ATVs, golf carts, etc.) must bear a legible placard with the entrant's car number and class designation and are subject to pad-1.8. dock speed restrictions.

3.0. Race (Wheel-to-Wheel) Supplemental Regulations

- 3.1.
- Race [wheel-to-wheel] Supplemental Regulations
 Race Entry & Registration
 Races are open to drivers holding a valid current MCSCC, SCCA (Pro, National/Full Comp/Major or Regional/Novice with one race signoff minimum), WHRRI, BMWCCA (full), EMRA, CASC, PCA(full), NASA (full), ACC Levels 1 and 2, SVRA, or VMC racing license. Vintage/Historic groups are additionally open to drivers holding valid current SCCA Vintage/ LSC or other received provide proof of 3.1.1. tage, HSR or other recognized license or be able to provide proof of

anticipation in events from other Vintage groups. 3.1.1.1 Other licenses to be evaluated on an individual basis by the Event Chief Steward in consort with the Competition Licensing Director and Competition Director.

- 14 thru 17 year olds may compete if they hold a Midwestern Council Minor Participation License, or a competition license from a recognized sanction body and conform to all procedures required of that license. 3.1.2.1. Persons entering this event with an MCSCC Minor Probation 3.1.2.
 - License must personally present this license to the Event Chief Steward accompanied by his attending parent/guardian before
 - Steward accompanied by his attending parent/guardian before going out on the track. If another sanctioning body license is used, the minor driver with the attending parent/guardian needs to present the Event Chief Steward a copy of the, "Minor Release of Liability and Indemnity Agreement" (Minor Waiver) provided to the sanction-ing body for the Competition License, indicating car number and class in which the minor will be participating. Should this copy not be available, some form of verification of parent or guardianship needs to be available. It is the responsibility of the Minor Participant to personally retrieve his license from the Event Chief Steward accompanied 3.1.2.2.
 - 3123 retrieve his license from the Event Chief Steward accompanied by his attending parent/guardian before leaving the track property.
 - Before the attending parent/guardian leaves the track property, he must report to the event Chief Steward that he is doing so 3.1.2.4. before leaving and again upon his return. The minor participant will NOT be allowed on the race track if the attending parent/ guardian is not present.
- All drivers must be prepared to show at registration a current approved 3.1.3. competition license.
- 3.1.4. Drivers and cars may enter more than one race group (at additional fee) providing they meet the appropriate class, safety and license requirements. Cars running in multiple race groups must have a tech sticker and appropriate class designation for each group, and attend Drivers Meetings for each group if separate meetings are held. All cars running UNR are subject to the approval of the Event Chief Steward. Race officials reserve the right to alter the schedule or race groups for
- 3.2.
- Race officials reserve the right to alter the schedule of race groups for good and sufficient reason, and to reject any entry at their discretion. Officials reserve the right to reassign car numbers where required. **Refunds:** Requests for refund must be made in writing. Requests may be delivered to Registration or mailed to the Registrar, postmarked by Friday,October 25, 2019. No refunds will be made if the car has entered the track surface for practice, qualifying or the race. Refunds will not be made until eligibility is verified by T&S. Refunds will be made for only the basic entry fee (or co-driver fee) less a \$25 processing fee. **Trophies:** Trophies will awarded to the top 50% of entries in each class startion the race and may be picked up in the Pavilion as race results. 3.3
- 34 starting the race and may be picked up in the Pavilion as race results become official.

4.0. 4.1. Race Tech & Impound

- To be allowed on track, all cars are to display a sticker issued by the Chief of Tech or his/her designated assistant indicating that, in his/her opinion, the car conforms to all safety regulations and marking require-ments as detailed in the MCSCC GCR.
- 4.2. Drivers whose competition vehicles have logbooks issued by other sanctioning bodies must present all logbooks at any technical inspection. All drivers must wear a Snell Foundation approved helmet. Helmets meeting at least Snell SA2010 rating are required. 4.3.
- The scales at impound are the official scales. Scales will be available 4.4.
- throughout the weekend. 4.5.
- Sound control All cars are required to comply with the decibel limit established by the track (See BHF Track Regulations). If a car is record-

ed in excess of the limit during an on track session, the first two times driver will be notified of the infraction as the car enters the paddock and instructed to make repairs. If the car is subsequently recorded in excess of the limit it will be Black Flagged and disqualified from further competition

5.0. **Race Timing & Scoring**

- 5.1. AMB TranX 260 transponders are required for all wheel-to-wheel entries. A limited number of transponders will be available for rental. Rental Fee (refundable.) Rental Fee and Deposit requires cash, or two separate checks (no credit cards.) Rentals will be handled at registration. Renters will be notified where to return the transponder and retrieve the deposit. DO NOT take transponders into the building which houses Timing and Scoring. Transponders are also available for purchase from My Laps Sports Timing at 678-816-4000 or online at www.mylaps.com, as well as from other sources.
- All cars must display registration assigned numbers per the GCR. Failure to conform will result in written/verbal notification by the Stewards. Cars 5.2. appearing in subsequent sessions without conforming will receive a Black Flag. The car will then be directed to the paddock for repairs. If the second offence is during a qualifying session, no time will be counted prior to the issuance of the Black Flag for a grid position. The car will be allowed to return to the track after repairs have been completed during practice and qualifying sessions. Should a car fail to conform to the GCR number requirements during a race, the car will receive a Black Flag and be directed to the paddock. Drivers are responsible for providing all materials needed to create acceptable numbers.
- Drivers (and co-drivers) must complete 5 verified laps of practice and/or 5.3. equalifying in order to be eligible for the race, or have permission of the Event Chief Steward.
- 5.3.1. Grid positions for races will be determined by computerized electronic timing system.
- 5.3.2. A driver may elect to start from the back of the grid regardless what the best timed lap for the car may be.

5.4. **Co-Drivers**

- 5.4.1. Co-drivers must complete 25% of race laps to be eligible for points and trophy.
- 5.4.2. A driver change slip must be turned in at the head of the pit lane at the beginning of each session and any time a driver change takes place.
- Procedures will be detailed at the drivers meeting. Any refueling during the race must be done with the engine off and the driver out of the car, following all requirements as detailed in the Mid-western Council General Competition Regulations (GCR). A crew mem-ber must stand by with a fire extinguisher provided by the entrant. Pit lane fire extinguishers provided by the facility are for emergency use DNL X. All crew involved in the refueing must be wearing long pages 5.4.3. ONLY. All crew involved in the refueling must be wearing long pants, long sleeved shirt, closed shoes, a balaclava and eye protection. Any car using an aux fuel tank fitted for this event must be inspected by Tech.
- 5.4.4. The Qualifying time used for the race grid must be that of the driver starting the race.
- 5.4.5. Co-Drivers must present driving gear (helmet, suit, shoes, etc.) for Tech Inspection prior to competing in on-track activities.

6.0. Race General

- Safety Belts, Helmets, and all driving gear must be worn during cool off and 6.1. victory laps.
- All drivers, with their cars, involved in metal to metal contact will be directed 6.2. to impound immediately upon exiting the track with or without assistance. A Steward will meet them there to inspect the vehicles and collect reports from the drivers involved. The car and driver will remain in impound until released by the Steward. Cars involved in consecutive race groups may be released
- from Impound immediately by the Steward, but must return to Impound after that session, before returning to the Paddock.
 6.3. Blocking is defined as making more than one move, left or right, to impede an overtaking car. When reported, the offender will receive a Blocking flag (waived Blue Flag accompanied by a furled Black Flag) from the starter. If
- waved blue rad accompanied by a finited black rady inter starter. If you continue to be reported blocking, you will be issued the Black Flag. The first three (3) finishers in each class in each race must report to the Podi-um area adjacent to the Pavilion following each race. Officials will attempt to notify you of your need to report to the Podium. However, if you believe you are eligible, go there anyway. 6.4.

8.0. BFR Track Regulations

- 8.1.2. Noise Pollution Regulation: No race car or engine, including showroom cars with open exhaust, shall be run before 8:00 AM or after 6:00 PM on any weekend day. All racing or on-track activities shall be conducted at a decibel level not in excess of 103 decibels as measured 50 feet from the track.
- 8.1.3. A Gate Pass indicating you have registered for the event must be presented to Gate Guard to allow your entry onto the property of Blackhawk Farms Raceway.
- ALL PET ANIMALS MUST BE LEASHED OR CONFINED. 8.1.4.
- 8.1.5.
- 8.1.6. No two or three wheel vehicles allowed except for race officials use or use as race support vehicles. Only licensed drivers 16 and above may
- operate race support vehicles or golf carts. 8.1.7. BFR Concession Stand will be available for most events. Gas, oil, water and air are available. Souvenirs, film and other consumables are available in Corner 10 shop. Environmentally hazardous waste MUST be disposed of in appropriate receptacles. All used tires must be removed from BFR premises.
- 8.1.8. Electric power is available at a rate of \$25 for a weekend event or \$10 for a single weekday event. Those that plug into electric power prior to purchasing a tag will be charged \$30 for the weekend. or \$15 for a weekday. Tags for outlets will be issued at time of plug-in and payment may be made in the Pit Stop store.
- A \$10.00 per event fee is charged for all scooter or cart style pit support vehicles. The rate for the season is \$25. 8.1.9.
