Annapolis and Anne Arundel County Scholarship Trust

The Annapolis Trust was founded in 2000 to serve low-income, first-generation-to-college students. It was founded by Reginald "Reggie" Broddie, the former CEO of the Annapolis Boys and Girls Clubs. He realized that many of the students who successfully benefitted from the Club programs did not have the financial resources to continue their educational journey to college. Reggie teamed up with longtime board member, Crispin Etherington, to form the Annapolis Trust.

The Trust has awarded 70 scholarships to date. Even more impressive is the 70% graduation rate of these scholars, more than six (6) times the rate of first-generation-to-college students according to Pell Research. In addition to college support, the Trust has awarded high school students over 25 scholarships to attend Gordonston International Summer Camp in Scotland. These students see a world outside of their own socio-economic neighborhoods. For most, it is their first plane trip and they are empowered by being part of an international community.

The Trust programs emphasize the importance of mentoring, vocational exploration, college prep and planning, financial responsibility and career networking.

I am involved in multiple organizations, and I have done community service to make an impact in the D.C. community.
