



Porsche Owners Club COVID-19 Autocross Event Policy

In light of the current Coronavirus situation, all reasonable attempts will be made to minimize the exposure to the virus. New procedures have been developed and will be put into place for events going forward.

Under the Current CDC Guidelines, we have put the following in place:

1. Before the event

- a. Event registration is completed online, requiring no in-person contact
- b. We will remind drivers not to attend the event if they or someone close to them has become sick. Specifically, If they (or someone close to them) are sick or symptomatic, they should stay home. Symptoms include fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea.
- c. We will remind drivers that they should not participate if they are in a high-risk category, as defined by the CDC
- d. We will remind drivers that may have at-risk family members at home. Drivers should do their best to keep these at-risk family members safe
- e. We will remind drivers that Government officials have the power to end current and future events, including potential monitoring by law enforcement and the health department. We will remind drivers that our venues can also shut down our events if they perceive that we are not behaving appropriately. We will remind drivers to behave as if their day of racing, and everyone else's, depends on it – because it does. Noncompliance with the safety guidelines may result in their removal from the event.
- f. A COVID-19 assumption of Risk and Waiver is part of our registration process
- g. As we are not holding drivers' meetings in-person, driver notes are part of the registration process and are emailed as reminders before the event

2. At the track

- a. We will remind drivers to respect their fellow members. Since opinions about current guidelines vary widely, all members' views should be respected. Club members will be reminded to behave respectfully, and keep it about the racing, as that's why we're here.
- b. Drivers must go through our checkpoint and all drivers will read and sign appropriate forms and waivers, including the Covid-19 waiver (Sample attached)
 - i. We will take the temperatures of each attendee. This check is performed as a primary check, and if the initial result is at or above 100.4, a secondary check is performed using a different temperature measuring device. If the potential attendee fails both checks, they are not allowed to enter the facility.
 - ii. Our team members, along with other volunteers, will provide detailed instructions to all attendees on maintaining social distancing and will circulate throughout the event to remind and enforce the social distancing protocols.
 - iii. Each driver will be allowed one guest at this event.
- c. Registration
 - i. Cloth face coverings and social distancing are mandatory during the registration process
 - ii. All attempts are made to hold registration in an outdoor environment
 - iii. Hand sanitizer is provided at registration
 - iv. Attendees are encouraged to bring their own pen if waivers need to be signed
- d. We mandate social distancing and wearing of face cloth face coverings throughout the event

- i. Grid and Start workers must wear a cloth face covering at all times
- e. Drivers meetings have been canceled, and information will be emailed in its place
- f. Driver instruction is usually part of our event; more experienced drivers ride along with new drivers
 - i. We have removed in-person instruction and will use a lead and follow sessions on the track to bring new drivers up to speed

3. After the Event

- a. If any attendees test positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of attending an event they are asked to report their positive test to the POC and the POC will communicate to the proper authorities.

The POC is open to implementing other protocols that the Track, City, County, or State may require. As Coronavirus guidelines are changing on a frequent basis, the POC will work to adapt to these changes. If guidelines that are in place on event day allow for additional freedoms (e.g. permission for limited spectators), or additional restrictions, the POC will address these changes.
