#### I. General

This is an easy-to-follow GTA Rally. It is a competitive event run on public roads at posted speed limits, following all traffic laws. This is <u>NOT</u> a race. Do not violate any traffic laws upon penalty of disqualification. Scoring is based on comparative times through "unmarked" check-points, and correctly answering questions. Strict adherence to the National Road Rally Rules does not apply. This is a social event and is eligible for points toward Cincinnati Region's championship series.

This rally is open to both SCCA members and non-members (a member discount is offered if at least one competitor is a current SCCA member).

#### II. Course

This is a 'Timing' Rally with Simple instructions showing the turn type and direction, numbered in the I# column, and some simple non-visual questions numbered in the Q# column. During the course of your travels you will be timed between 'unmarked' checkpoints. All roads are paved. Be mindful of patches of rough pavement, potholes, loose gravel in spots, and lawn clippings from mowing. The route goes through several areas of reduced speed limit and one lane bridges – please be mindful. Some roads have high speed limits (55). The course is approximately 66 miles.

### III. Questions

Questions are not related to visuals along the route but relate to the theme of the rally. Blank answers will be scored against you. Print your answers clearly in the answer column ONLY. Answers written outside this column will be counted as a miss.

Bonus Question: The bonus question refers to the number of RR tracks (pairs) you actually drive over (tires on track) You will pass through the same crossings more than once, count each pass. There is a separate column for you to keep track of the tracks. The bonus question will be used only for a tie break and will not be deducted from your score.

## IV. Scoring

Scoring will be done by comparing your two runs through the timing section between the check-points. Timing will be noted to the second, as HH:MM:SS. You will be given 1 point for each second differential between runs - Low Score wins.

EXAMPLE: First Run 01:18:34 Second Run 01:20:15 = (1:19:75)

Difference 01:19:75 - 01:18:34 = 00:1:41 = 101 seconds (points)

Ties not broken by the Bonus Question will be broken by the Rally Master with a coin toss, dice roll, highest card draw, or other method to be determined by the Rally Master.

The Rally Master has the final decision in all scoring disputes. Both driver and navigator will be awarded points for their finishing position for the series championship. Refer to "Series Rules" for details.

CAR NUMBERS: Insure your car number is visible from both driver and passenger sides of your vehicle.

TRAINS: If you are delayed by a train note the location and your wait time, your score will be adjusted accordingly.
