#### SCCA Licensing Accreditation:

# Step one: Attend an accredited SCCA Licensing school and apply for your novice license.

Successful completion of the school satisfies the SCCA driver's school requirement to obtain a SCCA Novice Permit License. You may enter any SCCA Regional event with a Novice Permit License.

# Step two: Work towards the next level of licensing, a FULL Competition Racing License.

A FULL Competition Racing License is required to enter SCCA Majors and Super Tour Events. Three SCCA sanctioned regional race event weekends on a Novice Permit License will allow you to apply for a Full Competition Racing License.

See below how more days with Pro Drive will quickly get you to a FULL Competition Racing License:

# SCCA Accreditation Licensing levels with Pro Drive Racing School:

- 1-Day Racing School (Standard Accreditation)
  Graduates receive credit for 1 SCCA school on their SCCA Novice Permit License.
  - o you may enter any SCCA Regional event. After completing <u>three</u> SCCA regional event weekends you may apply for your FULL competition racing license
- 2-Day Racing School (Standard PLUS Accreditation)
  Graduates receive credit for 1 SCCA school and 1 SCCA sanctioned regional race event weekend on their SCCA Novice Permit License.
  - you may enter any SCCA Regional event. After completing two SCCA regional event weekends you may apply for your FULL competition racing license
- 3-Day Racing School (Advanced Accreditation)
  Graduates receive credit for 1 SCCA school and 2 SCCA sanctioned regional race event weekend on their SCCA Novice Permit License.
  - o you may enter any SCCA Regional event. After completing <u>one</u> SCCA regional event weekend you may apply for your FULL competition racing license

# Steps to apply for an SCCA License

- 1. Join SCCA. Become a member by going to <a href="www.scca.com">www.scca.com</a> and clicking on the "Join SCCA" button.
- 2. Apply for your Novice Permit. Follow the licensing steps at: Sports Car Club of America (scca.com)
- 3. Register for your race. When you are ready to enter your first SCCA Regional Race, please register at: <a href="https://www.oregonscca.motorsportreg.com">www.oregonscca.motorsportreg.com</a>
  - a. Bring your Novice Permit along with a passport photo to your event. The Novice Permit will need to be filled out by the driving school as well as an SCCA Steward
- 4. Is your car track ready?
  - Make sure your car meets all the requirements for SCCA. You can look up the requirements in the SCCA General Competition Rule Book (GCR): <a href="http://www.scca.com/downloads">http://www.scca.com/downloads</a> Click on the most recent Updated Rule

- Book. Most importantly, make sure your car meets the safety requirements listed in Section 9 of the GCR. You may also contact Tim Scott, SCCA Tech Official at 360.430.7577.
- b. Have your car tech'd for competition. Tech is typically open the afternoon before the first day of an Oregon Region event or by 7am the morning of.
- 5. Purchase all the required drivers gear:
  - a. Helmet with Snell sticker SA2015 or later, one-piece drivers suit that effectively cover the body from the neck to the ankles and wrists. All suits shall bear an SFI 3.2A/1 or higher certification label. Underwear of fire resistant material shall be used, unless you have a SFI 3-2A/5 or higher drivers suit. Gloves, socks made of fire resistant material, driving shoes and neck restraint.
  - b. Refer to GCR 9.3.20...
