SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS



This event is governed by the 2026 General Competition Rules (GCR) and Category Specifications, as amended for 2026 per "Fastrack" and these Supplemental Regulations. This event will be conducted in the spirit of SCCA's Welcoming Environment shown in the GCR.

The event is open to all SCCA Novice Permit holders who have satisfied the school requirements, to current holders of SCCA Full Competition licenses, and to SCCA members who hold other SCCA approved licenses, per the GCR.

This is a 2026 CenDiv Championship Series point event. Series rules, including regional-only car classes can be found on the CenDiv website <http://www.cendiv-scca.org> CenDiv Divisional Championship Series, presented by TRO Manufacturing & Brake O Meter, stickers are provided free of charge available at Tech. This event is also part of the 2026 Land O' Lakes Championship Series.

REFUNDS: If you pre-enter and do not cancel your entry thru motorsportsreg.com or by notifying the Chief Registrar by **3:00 PM May 22, 2026**, you will be charged a \$25 cancellation fee. A refund will be made if the entry does not touch the pit lane and/or race track. Withdrawal notifications are accepted by email, phone or in person to the Chief Registrar or via motorsportsreg.com and would be greatly appreciated in advance of the event.

PASSES: Each entry receives credentials for the driver plus up to three crew members. An Entrant at the event who is not the driver and is not on any Prep Shop list must be listed as a crew member. Additional passes (over crew) may be purchased at registration for \$10 each. Minors 16 years and younger will be issued guest passes at no charge. All crew members signing in under a prep shop list must be an SCCA member and are allowed to have one guest. Weekend memberships are available for purchase if needed. Non-participant SCCA members must present a valid membership card for admission; there may be a charge. Workers must present a current license and membership card at registration. Volunteer workers, guests, and crew must sign for their own passes and must arrive during posted registration hours.

LATE/EARLY ARRIVAL GATE FEES: If participants arrive early or late (when SCCA Registration is closed) entrance to the track may be possible by paying BIR track gate fees. Such payments will not be reimbursed.

VINTAGE RACE GROUP: Only cars approved by Vintage Sports Car Racing Inc. (VSCR) are permitted to participate in vintage practice, qualifying or race sessions. Questions regarding participation contact Steve Nichols (612) 306-1022.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

SOUND CONTROL: The maximum sound reading allowed by local ordinance is 103 db. Sound may be monitored but may not be enforced. If sound is monitored the station will be located on driver's left near turn 2.

TECH: On Friday evening, Tech is located at the white building in the paddock. On Saturday and Sunday Tech is located at the scales, behind Turn 13, where cars exit the race track. Drivers must present their helmet with a current year sticker (signifying that their driver gear and helmet have previously been inspected in the current year) are not required to present their gear at tech. Only the helmet and vehicle logbook are required to be presented at tech.

A driver whose helmet has not been issued a current year sticker must present all driver gear (as listed in the GCR), with the vehicle logbook. If the logbook does not have a current Annual Technical Inspection stamp the vehicle must also be presented. All other Tech requirements are described in GCR 9.3.

TRANSPONDERS: All SCCA and Vintage competition vehicles are required to comply with specifications described in GCR 5.10.3. Transponder times are the official times for all competition vehicles. The driver is responsible for providing correct information to Timing and Scoring. Any information gathered from data collection systems and/or personal timing systems is unofficial and will not be used by race officials.

TIMING: Live timing will be available during the event. Live timing is neither official nor protestable. Timing information will be available at www.race-monitor.com and/or speedhive.mylaps.com.

IN-CAR CAMERAS: All cars sessions with the exception of Vintage classes, must have a forward-facing camera that is recording at all times while on track which provides a clear horizontal field of view of the cars and track ahead as per GCR 9.3.11

RADIO FREQUENCIES: FM Broadcast of paddock announcements can be received on FM 87.9

The radio frequencies below are reserved for race operations and may not be used by competitors.

Race officials may designate other frequencies for race administration.

DECALS: Competition vehicles must display the official SCCA Summit Racing Equipment Road Racing decal per GCR section 9.3.29.C (Figure 4) To be eligible for the CenDiv Divisional Championship Series presented by TRO Manufacturing and BrakeOMeter, cars are required to display visible CenDiv Series stickers on both sides of the vehicle. Stickers will be provided free of charge and may be obtained at tech.

SPEC RACER FORD (SRF) GEN2 CARS are required to have orange tape wrapped around the top of the roll bar, so the volunteer workers can differentiate them from the GEN3 cars.

AWARDS: Trophies for all races will be awarded according to the GCR. Trophies shall be picked up at the Control Tower. No trophies will be mailed. CenDiv Divisional Championship Series points will be awarded per CenDiv rules.

GRID: Cars that are not in position on the grid prior to the 3 (three) minute signal relinquish their starting positions. They will be held behind other cars and must start from the back of the field.

PIT LANE RULES:

- a. Proper credentials, closed toe shoes and shirts with sleeves are required in pit lane, false grid and on the grid.
- b. No smoking in pit lane.
- c. No one under 16 years old will be allowed in the pit lane unless they are registered as a driver in this event.
- d. All competitors must maintain a slow, prudent speed on pit lane at all times. Use the transit lane until reaching and upon exiting your pit stall. Do not drive through other pit stalls.
- e. Tire scrubbing is not permitted at any time in the pit lane.
- f. Please do not put any equipment in pit lane, including at the pit wall, +/- 10 feet of timing finish line, as this may interfere with timing and scoring electronics.
- g. When entering the track from the pit lane, stay drivers left up to corner 13. There is a blend line.
- h. **Exit from the pit lane is at pit exit only.** Do not exit the pit lane at any other point into the spectator area.

RACE COURSE RULES:

- a. **Start, Finish and Timing:** All race starts and restarts will be from the Start Stand, which is located at Turn 1. The checkered flag will be displayed at the Finish Stand, which is located across from Timing & Scoring, before corner 12. All race and qualifying timing begin and ends at the timing loop in front of Timing & Scoring. The loop is marked by orange cones on each side of the track approximately 20 feet before the Finish Stand. For all races, timing starts when the front row crosses the front straight timing line during the pace lap. On a pace lap, the Pace Car paces the field to Turn 13 and then exits the track surface. Be prepared for this to happen. The front row then paces the field until the green flag is given.
- b. **Pit-in is at Turn 9, driver's left in the carousel.**
- c. **At the end of each session, all running cars shall exit the track and/or pit lane by progressing to turn 13 and shall exit the race course to the paddock or impound as directed by race officials.** It is not necessary to exit via the pits; you can proceed directly on track to Turn 13.
- d. **Black Flag All Procedure:** In the event of a "black flag all" during an on-track session, all cars shall follow the pace car into the pits via pit - in at turn 9 and stop and remain in the pits until released. Cars SHALL NOT exit the track through Turn 13 unless they are directed to do so AFTER leaving the pits.

- e. The Chief Steward may declare any race to be a timed race, to facilitate the event schedule due to unforeseen circumstances such as excessive cleanup time, weather, etc.
- f. Provisional results for all race and qualifying sessions shall include lap times and shall be posted as soon as possible, outside Timing and Scoring in the Race Control tower.
- g. The fastest qualifier in a race group who selects the “outside pole” (per GCR) must notify the Grid Marshal at the front of the field before the five-minute warning is given for that race group.
- h. Split starts are at the discretion of the Chief Steward who must receive a request within one hour after posting the final grid.
- i. Tire scrubbing is permitted only after the apex of corner 13.
- j. If the Chief Steward allows the substitution of a car or driver, per GCR 5.12.3.A.6, any qualifying times earned for the original car / driver up to that point will be removed.
- k. Full course yellow procedures: Upon display of the full course yellow, the race leader must slow the field to the speed of the pace car at lights out on the initial pace lap as soon as practical. Trailing cars must pack up, using caution that cars ahead may be at a much slower pace.
- l. A competitor involved in contact, or who has violated flag rules (yellow, black, red, or checker) must report to Impound (located at the scales) with their car and remain there until released by the Black Flag Steward or Chief Steward.
- m. All on track body contact (including contact during drafting) that causes a car to act erratically and results in a change of position, or a car leaving the course, will be investigated.
- n. Any driver found to have driven on course in any vehicle before having properly signed the waiver will be disqualified from the event with no refund of entry fee and will be removed from the premises.
- o. Black Flag stations are at Turn 6 and Finish. If you receive a black flag, you must proceed directly to the scales/impound area at Turn 13 and talk to the Steward there.

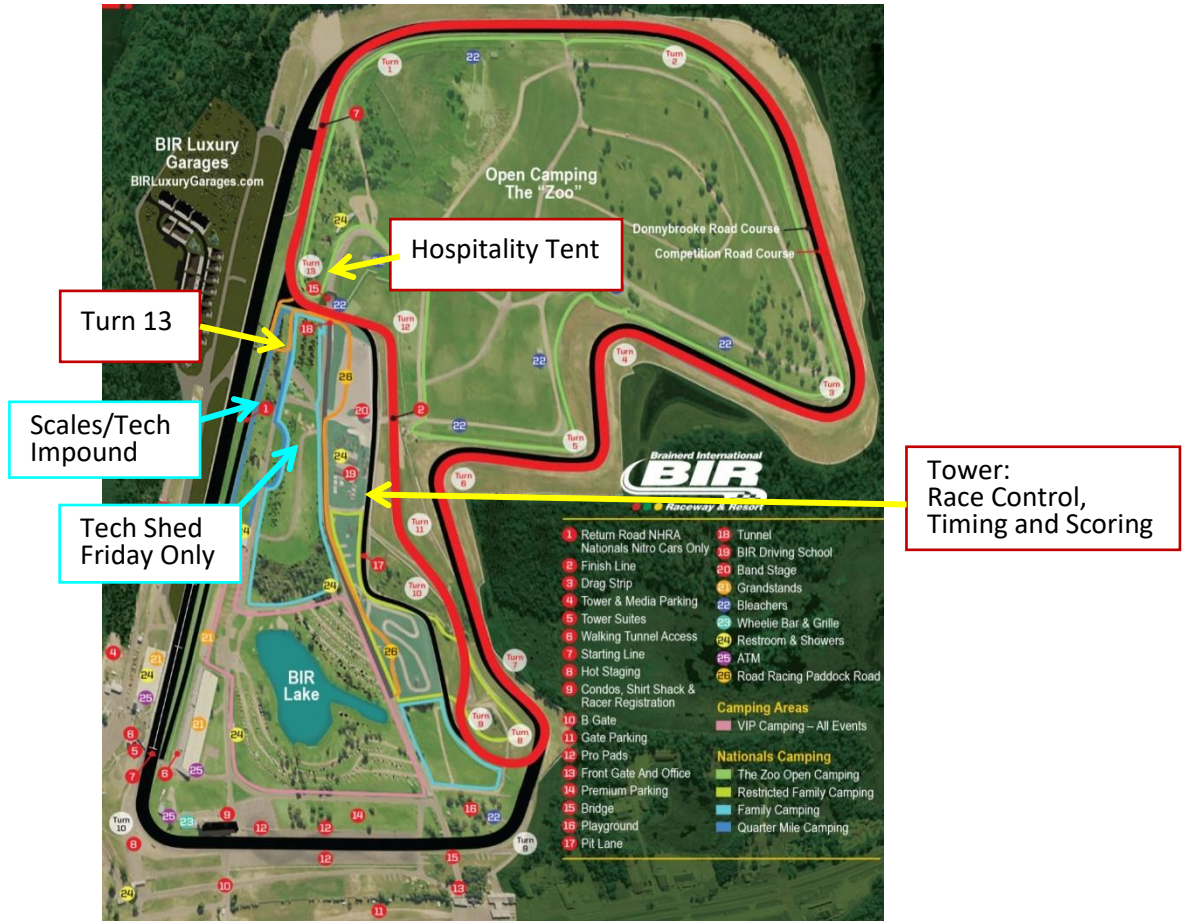
LUNCH BREAK TRACK TOUR PARTICIPANTS RULES:

- a. All adult participants must sign a SCCA event release and waiver form.
- b. Minor participants must have the SCCA Minor release and waiver form signed by both parents and guardians; or have a completed Annual Minor Waiver on file with SCCA (Annual Minor Parental Consents and Annual Waiver Minor Form).
- c. All passengers must be twelve (12) years or older to participate and be capable of fitting in the vehicle's safety restraint system. (Subject to track specific age limits.)
- d. A brief “driver’s meeting” will be held that will discuss no passing, no “hanging back”, no cell phone usage or texting by the driver is allowed and maintaining adequate distances between cars etc.
- e. Only non-racing, street legal and licensed vehicles that have permanently mounted passenger seats with adequate restraint systems may be used.
- f. Vehicles may only be operated by drivers 18 years of age or over with a current, valid state driver’s license.
- g. Front and back pace vehicles shall be used. Pace vehicles shall not exceed a typical pace speed of 45-50 mph.
- h. Cars must be driven with caution, at a speed consistent with the pace vehicles, not to exceed 50 mph. Cars must not be driven at race speed. Passing is not allowed.

PADDOCK RULES:

- a. Noise Pollution Regulation: No race car or engine, including street cars with open exhaust, shall be run before 8:30 a.m. or after 6:00 p.m.
- b. A wristband, indicating you have registered for the event must be presented to the person at the Main Gate to allow your entry onto the property of Brainerd International Raceway.
- c. All minors must always be under direct parental or acting guardian supervision.
- d. Drivers are responsible for the conduct of their crew and guests.
- e. Drivers may be held responsible for harm to property, including damage to the track and to the environment. Fees charged for the removal / disposal of hazardous waste or used tires will be assessed to the responsible driver.
- f. All pet animals must be leashed or humanely confined and all and any poop must be scooped.
- g. All trash must be placed in the receptacles provided.

- h. No vehicular traffic will be allowed on the track racing surface from 6pm – 8am without the permission of the Chief Steward.
- i. Irresponsible use of any vehicle is prohibited. Riding on the outside of any vehicle or trailer is prohibited. These vehicles shall be operated by street licensed drivers. All race support vehicles must have race car number and class prominently displayed. These vehicles shall be operated by street licensed drivers.
- j. The use of motorized or non-motorized scooters, skateboards, inline skates or any type of wheeled shoe is forbidden. No radio-controlled devices may be operated from 8:00am – 6:30pm.
- k. Firearms, weapons, explosives and illegal drugs are strictly prohibited on the premises.
- l. The use of Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS), better known as drones, is prohibited
