Supplemental Regulations – Schools Out – 4/23/2023

1. General Event Regulations

- 1.1. This event is sanctioned by the Midwestern Council of Sports Car Clubs, and insurance conforms to MCSCC requirements. This event will be held under the MCSCC General Competition Regulations, Track Regulations and all Supplemental Regulations.
- 1.2. Drivers are responsible for notifying crew and guests of the hours Registration is open. Entry may not be available beyond posted hours.
- 1.3. Minor guests must be under adult supervision at all times.
- 1.4. A slow and safe speed shall be maintained in the paddock at all times. Reckless driving (such as warming/cooling of tires or brakes) is prohibited. Riding on the exterior of vehicles is prohibited.
- 1.5. Paddock/Parking on access roads is prohibited. Paddock/Parking on paved surfaces must only be done in the designated areas as indicated by the chief steward or designated representative.
- 1.6. No intoxicants may be consumed by drivers, crew or guests before the end of the last race or other on-track activity. There may be General Admission spectators not registered with event sponsors which are not subject to this rule.
- 1.7. No illegal drugs or controlled substance shall be tolerated on the track premises at any time unless prescribed by a doctor.
- 1.8. Any and all protests, questions or complaints against any competitor's car or driving or against any race specialty should be made to the Event Chief Steward or his/her designated assistant as stipulated in the GCR. In no case should complaints be directed to any race worker in any specialty.
- 1.9. All race support vehicles (ATVs, golf carts, etc.) must bear a legible placard with the entrant's car number and class designation.

2. Race (Wheel-to-Wheel) Supplemental Regulations

2.1. Race Entry & Registration

- 2.1.1. Races are open to drivers holding a valid current MCSCC, SCCA (Pro, Full Competition or Novice with one race signoff minimum), WHRRI, BMWCCA(full), EMRA, CASC, PCA(full), NASA(full), *ACC Levels 1 and 2*, SVRA, VSCDA Driver Card (3 races minimum), or VMC racing license. Vintage/Historic groups are additionally open to drivers holding valid current SCCA Vintage, HSR or other recognized license or be able to provide proof of participation in events from other Vintage groups
 - 2.1.1.1. Other licenses to be evaluated on an individual basis by the Event Chief Steward in consort with the Competition Licensing Director and Competition Director.
- 2.1.2. 14 thru 17 year olds may compete if they hold a Midwestern Council Minor Participation License or a competition license from a recognized sanctioning body and conform to all procedures required of that license.
 - 2.1.2.1. Persons *who* enter this event with an MCSCC Minor Probation License must personally present his license to the Event Chief Steward accompanied by his attending parent/guardian.
 - 2.1.2.2. If another sanctioning body license is used, the minor driver with the attending parent/guardian needs to present to the Event Chief Steward a copy of the "MINOR RELEASE OF LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT" (Minor Waiver) provided to the sanctioning body for the Competition License indicating car number and class in which the minor will be participating. Should this copy not be available, some form of verification of parent or guardianship needs to be available.
 - 2.1.2.3. It is the responsibility of the Minor Participant to personally retrieve his license from the Event Chief Steward accompanied by his attending parent/guardian before leaving the track property.
 - 2.1.2.4. Before the attending parent/guardian leaves the track property, he must report to the event Chief Steward that he is doing so before leaving and again upon his return. The minor participant will NOT be allowed on the race track if the attending parent/guardian is not present.
- 2.1.3. All drivers must be prepared to show at registration a current approved competition license.
- 2.1.4. Drivers and cars may enter more than one race group (at additional fee) providing they meet the appropriate class, safety and license requirements. Cars running in multiple race groups must have a tech sticker and display appropriate class designation for each group, and attend Drivers Meetings for each group if separate meetings are held. All cars running UNR are subject to the approval of the Event Chief Steward.
- 2.2. Race officials reserve the right to alter the schedule or race groups for good and sufficient reason, and to re-assign car numbers where required.
- 2.3. Single entry fee is \$315 for a pre-registered entrant and \$365 for a walk-in (not pre-registered) entrant. Pre-registration closes at 10 pm on the Tuesday immediately preceding the event weekend. A cancellation fee of \$50 will be collected for any pre-registered entrant that does not cancel by the pre-registration deadline above. Full refunds will be given for mechanical failures of Saturday entrants and driver's not receiving a license. Such requests must be made to a LSCC or SCSCC representative before the end of the Sunday event. Subsequent entries for a single entrant beyond the first are \$155.

3. Race Tech & Impound

- 3.1. To be allowed on track, all cars are to display a sticker issued by the Chief of Tech or his/her designated assistant indicating that, in his/her opinion, the car conforms to all safety regulations and marking requirements as detailed in the MCSCC GCR.
- 3.2. Drivers whose competition vehicles have logbooks issued by other sanctioning bodies must present all logbooks at any technical inspection.
- 3.3. The scales at impound are the official scales. Scales will be available throughout the weekend.
- 3.4. Sound control - All cars are required to comply with the decibel limit established by the track (see track regulations). If a car is

recorded in excess of the limit during an on track session, the first two times driver will be notified of the infraction as the car enters the paddock and instructed to make repairs. If the car is subsequently recorded in excess of the limit it will be Black Flagged and disqualified from further competition.

4. Race Timing & Scoring

- 4.1.1. AMB TransX 260 transponders are required for all wheel-to-wheel entries. A limited number of transponders will be available for rental. Rental Fee is \$50 for the weekend and requires a \$500 Security Deposit (refundable.) Rental Fee and Deposit requires cash, or two separate checks (no credit cards.) Rentals will be handled at registration. Renters will be notified where to return the transponder and retrieve the deposit. DO NOT take transponders into the building housing Timing and Scoring. Transponders are also available for purchase from MYLAPS Sports Timing at 678-816-4000 or online at www.mylaps.com, as well as from other sources.
- 4.2. All cars must display registration assigned numbers per the GCR. Failure to conform will result in written/verbal notification by the Stewards. Cars appearing in subsequent sessions without conforming will receive a Black Flag. The car will then be directed to the paddock for repairs. If the second offence is during a qualifying session, no time will be counted prior to the issuance of the Black Flag for a grid position. The car will be allowed to return to the track after repairs have been completed during practice and qualifying sessions. Should a car fail to conform to the GCR number requirements during a race, the car will receive a Black Flag and be directed to the paddock. Drivers are responsible for providing all materials needed to create acceptable numbers.
- 4.3. Drivers (and co-drivers) must complete 5 verified laps of practice and/or qualifying in order to be eligible for the race, or have permission of the Event Chief Steward.
 - 4.3.1. Grid positions for races will be determined by computerized electronic timing system.
 - 4.3.2. A driver may elect to start from the back of the grid regardless what the best timed lap for the car may be.

5. Race General

- 5.1. Safety belts, helmets and all driving gear must be worn during cool off and victory laps.
- 5.2. All drivers, with their cars, involved in metal to metal contact will be directed to impound immediately upon exiting the track with or without assistance. A Steward will meet them there to inspect the vehicles and collect reports from the drivers involved. The car and driver will remain in impound until released by the Steward. Cars involved in consecutive race groups may be released from impound immediately by the steward, but must return to impound after that session before returning to the Paddock.
- 5.3. Blocking is defined as making more than one move, left or right, to impede an overtaking car. When reported, the offender will receive a blocking flag from the Starter. The Blocking flag from the starter stand is the display of a waived Blue Flag accompanied by a Ferruled (Closed) Black Flag. If you continue to be reported to be blocking, you will be issued a black flag.
- 5.4. All MCSCC classes with DOT Tire requirements, excluding classes with spec tires as written in MCSCC GCR, are allowed to use NA Tires Slick tires provided the compound is Medium or harder.

6. Track Regulations

- 6.1. NOISE POLLUTION REGULATION: No race car or engine, including showroom cars with open exhaust, shall be run before 8:00 a.m. or after 6:00 p.m. on any weekend day or holiday or not before 9:00 a.m. or after 4:30 p.m. on weekdays (Monday through Friday). All racing or on-track activities shall be conducted at a decibel level not in excess of 103 decibels as measured Fifty (50) feet from the track.
- 6.2. WRISTBAND REQUIREMENT: A wristband indicating you have registered for the event must be presented to the person at the Main Gate to allow your entry onto the property of Blackhawk Farms Raceway.
- 6.3. All minors must be under direct parental or acting guardian supervision at all times.
- 6.4. Drivers/Riders are responsible for the conduct of their crews and guests.
- 6.5. All pet animals must be leashed or humanely confined and cleaned up after.
- 6.6. No two or three wheeled vehicles are allowed except for race officials' use or as race support vehicles. Only licensed drivers 16 years and older may operate race support vehicles or golf carts.
- 6.7. Our Concession Stand will be available for most events. Gas, oil, water, and air are available. Souvenirs and other consumables are available for purchase in the Pit Stop.
- 6.8. All trash must be placed in receptacles provided. Environmentally hazardous waste must be disposed of in appropriate receptacles. All used tires must be removed or the organization will be charged for their disposal.
- 6.9. All drivers and members will be responsible for notifying crews and guests concerning the hours of registration. A closing time will be included on the entry form. In the event no closing time is included on the entry form, the closing time shall be as set forth in Paragraph 1B of this Track Rental Agreement.
- 6.10. Electric power is available. Tags for the outlets will be issued at time of purchase from a track attendant or in the Pit Stop.
- 6.11. All drivers, members, officials, spectators, and invitees must comply with the Pit Vehicle Policy of BFR including the purchase and display of a Pit Vehicle Pass for each unit present on the Premises. Pit vehicles are not allowed on the competition track surface or hot pit lane at any time.
- 6.12. The use of Unmanned Aircraft Systems (UAS), better known as drones, is prohibited.



2022 Blackhawk Farms Raceway Pit Vehicle Registration and Agreement

As dictated by our insurance carrier for 2022, **Blackhawk Farms Raceway** requires that all pit and other unlicensed or off-road vehicles have a season sticker displayed on the vehicle and a registration agreement on file with the **Blackhawk Farms Raceway** office.

In consideration for being permitted to utilize and operate a motorized pit vehicle on the **Blackhawk Farms Raceway (BFR)** premises at any 2022 season event or activity, the vehicle owner and/or competition entrant:

1. Acknowledges and agrees that the vehicle shall be operated in compliance with the vehicle manufacturer's operating instructions and/or industry standards including those regarding riding/driving position and number of passengers.
2. Hereby assumes full responsibility for and assumes the risk of bodily injury, death, or property damage arising out of or related to the use of said vehicles whether caused by the negligence of owner and/or their operators, Blackhawk Farms Raceway, other pit vehicle operators or otherwise.
3. Acknowledges and agrees that all operators of said vehicles shall be at least 16 years old, have a valid state required driving license, and carry adequate general liability insurance applicable to the operation of their pit vehicles and that all operators shall provide such license, proof of insurance, and other applicable credentials upon request of a **Blackhawk Farms Raceway** or event official.
4. Hereby acknowledges that the use of motorized pit vehicles is dangerous and involves the risk of serious injury and/or death and/or property damage.
5. Acknowledges that all registered pit vehicles **MUST** display the owner's competition vehicle number and registration decal in a clearly visible location at all times while on BFR grounds.
6. Agrees that the pit vehicle will be operated in a responsible manner and according to all additional **Blackhawk Farms Raceway** regulations and instructions, including but not limited to posted speed limits, and hours of and allowed locations for operations.
7. Agrees that pit vehicles are not allowed on the competition track surface or hot pit lane at any time.
8. Acknowledges and agrees that unsafe or improper operation of the pit vehicles and/or any violation of regulations and instructions may, at the sole discretion of Blackhawk Farms Raceway, result in penalties against the owner and/or operators including but not limited to immediate impoundment of the pit vehicle, loss of racing privileges for the event for a first offense, and for the season for the second offense.
